


Lake District

The entire Lake District National Park, taking in all major summits, including Scafell, Helvellyn, Skiddaw, the Langdales and Old Man of Coniston. Also includes the Howgill Fells east of Kendal (the NW extension of Yorks Dales).



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General Summary for Thursday, 23 June, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 23 June, 2022

Warm and quite humid with strong sunshine for most areas. Light to moderate southerly winds. The west coast of Scotland will hold on to banks of low cloud, but some breaks forming. High cloud builds over Wales and central England, may locally result in a thunderstorm toward evening, drifting northwards.

Headline for Lake District

Warm, mostly sunny, light winds.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 23 June, 2022

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southwesterly 10 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely until late Dry most or all day. Toward sunset into night, chance of localised bursts of rain forming, possibly thundery.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills mostly clear Local banks of mist may cover westernmost fells for a few hours from dawn, will all disperse.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine most areas, some high cloud building. Very good or in afternoon excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	12C at dawn, rising to 15 to 17C, feeling humid.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Lake District - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly or variable, 10 to 20mph or sometimes less. Tending to increase toward evening. Mostly small, but sudden gusts may form around bursts of rain.	Southerly, but may vary, typically 15 to 25mph, possible lulls, but gusty 30-35mph in places around higher fells. Fairly small, but expect gusty conditions at times and may often impede walking where exposed on summits and ridges.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Increasing risk thundery downpours Chance of bursts of rain locally from early morning, but forming increasingly as the day progresses. By afternoon into evening, areas of rain lasting an hour or more. Some heavy downpours, risk hail and thunder.	Risk heavy downpours forming Local areas of rain are possible early in the day, but several hours likely largely dry. Showers then forming increasingly widely into afternoon, some heavy bursts, risk of hail and isolated thunder.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Forming widely in rain Varied cloud conditions: Lowering widely in rain, to form extensively at various levels, patches to lowest slopes. Southern fells most prone to cloud filling in, to lowest slopes hills nearest the coast. 50%	Forming mostly around showers A few patches around hills early morning, generally dispersing. Then most cloud above the hills, but patches forming around higher tops during and after showers, may fill in with fragments from forest canopies upward. 70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun fairly weak due to layers of high cloud, becoming overcast. Visibility good, slight haze, reducing where rain develops and murky if it sets in.	Sunshine mostly morning before cloud builds and tends to fill in. Coasts sunnier toward evening. Visibility often very good, but reduced where rain occurs.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	11C rising to 14 to 16C, feeling humid. Above the summits.	6C rising to 10C. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 24 June, 2022**

Turning more unsettled for several days through the weekend into early next week as a slow-moving area of low pressure affects Britain. Conditions will vary day-to-day, locally escaping dry some days, but expect some areas of persistent rain mixed with heavy or sometimes thundery showers almost anywhere. Wind speed also varied, mostly south or southwesterly, strengthening at times, may reach gale force on the high tops into next week. Feeling warm where sunshine develops, but cool in cloud and rain. Cloud will come and go on the hills, but lowering extensively during rain.

Forecast issued at 16:30 on Wednesday, 22 June, 2022
