

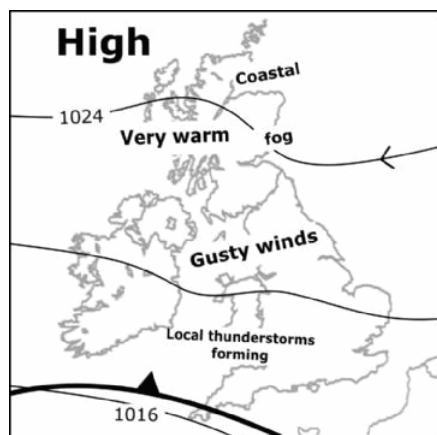
# Lake District

The entire Lake District National Park, taking in all major summits, including Scafell, Helvellyn, Skiddaw, the Langdales and Old Man of Conistone.



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## General Summary for Tuesday, 13 May, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 13 May, 2025

Strong warm sunshine for most places, very warm in western Scotland; beware sunburn and dehydration. Early fog draped around the north and east of Scotland and eastern Pennines, higher terrain above the fog, which will disperse back toward the North Sea coast. Gusty easterly winds England & Wales, locally southern Scotland.

### Headline for Lake District

Sunny and warm, but breezy.

## Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 13 May, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Easterly 15-25mph. Some gusts through elevated passes and over fell tops, particularly morning.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small, some uncomfortable gustiness.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Not expected</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Practically certain</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny. Excellent visibility though some haze at first.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	10 to 12C from dawn, only small rise during day, up to 14C western areas. Feeling cooler in the breeze, but offset by warm sunshine. Some western valleys approaching 25C during afternoon.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## Lake District - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Easterly 15mph, gusts 20mph.	Northeasterly 15 to 25mph, gusty in places.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small</b>	<b>Fairly small, but may affect comfortable walking and balance at times on exposed ridges, feeling rather cool.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain</b>	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little or none</b>  Brief fragments of low cloud may drift onto eastern hills early in day, otherwise the fells very likely clear all day.	<b>Largely clear, local patches</b>  Possible patchy cloud drifting onto some tops in north/east Lakes for a time, but all dispersing or lifting just above tops. Little if any further southwest.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy cloud then increasingly extensive strong sunshine. Some thin high cloud. Visibility excellent; slight haze lower down in the morning.	Mostly sunny toward the coast, some patchy cloud inland and mainly in east. Visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	7C from dawn (small change with height); reaching 11 to 13C afternoon, warmest west.  Above the summits	7C rising as high as 12C southwest Lakes, but east & northern fells stay cooler all day, feeling close to freezing in the breeze.  Above the summits

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 14 May, 2025

High pressure persists toward the north of Britain this week and likely continuing through the weekend, bringing more dry, warm and sunny weather. East to northeasterly breezes prevail, gusty at times around some hills, mainly England and Wales. Some coastal fog and low cloud drifting inland from the North Sea will affect eastern areas in the early mornings, but largely dispersing through middle of daytimes. Highest temperatures typically toward the west. Very dry ground conditions, beware high risk of fire.

### Forecast issued at 16:30 on Monday, 12 May, 2025
