

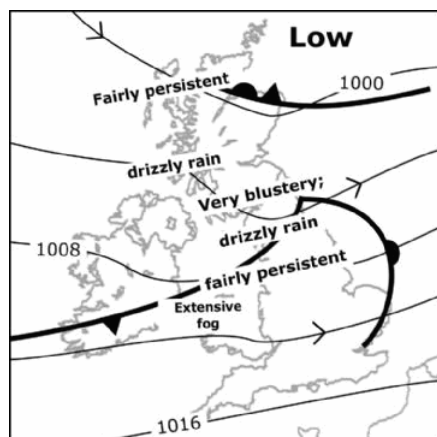
# Lake District

The entire Lake District National Park, taking in all major summits, including Scafell, Helvellyn, Skiddaw, the Langdales and Old Man of Conistone.



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## General Summary for Tuesday, 24 June, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 24 June, 2025

Frequent rain/drizzle onto most west coastal slopes, steadier rain for a time in the morning slipping east. High terrain mostly foggy, down to lower slopes in places along west coasts; best of breaks east Scotland and North Pennines. Blustery for most with risk of gales high terrain of England and north Wales.

### Headline for Lake District

Frequent rain and largely foggy; windy, near gale

## Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 24 June, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly 30 to 40mph. Strongest sustained winds around midday and afternoon with possibly stronger gusts over highest tops.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Very blustery over the fells, walking becoming arduous in places on exposed higher areas. Considerable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Fairly persistent, particularly western fells</b> Rain and drizzle fairly persistent west and southwest fells much of the day. Steadier rain in the morning for a few hours most areas. May fade to drizzly showers, small amounts east later in the day.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive</b> Shrouding the fells most likely all day, from mid-to-lower slopes up in west & southwest, some breaks above 600m east of Helvellyn.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, little or no sun. Visibility good below cloud, but often rather misty over fells, particularly west.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	10 or 11C, little change if any all day. Feeling near/below freezing in the wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 25 June, 2025

West to southwesterly winds prevail this week and a series of frontal systems come in from the Atlantic. Rain and drizzle most frequent in west with low cloud often covering hills, typically most extensive in Scotland. Higher cloud bases and drier further eastwards. Temperatures near average, or lower at times in Scotland. Often windy, risk of more extensive upland gales and some heavier rain as deeper areas of low pressure likely move in later in the week. Some indication of a brief settled spell into the weekend and rising temperatures, though northwest Scotland remaining at risk of frontal weather systems.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2025.
