








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General Summary for Tuesday, 24 June, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 24 June, 2025

Frequent rain/drizzle onto most west coastal slopes, steadier rain for a time in the morning slipping east. High terrain mostly foggy, down to lower slopes in places along west coasts; best of breaks east Scotland and North Pennines. Blustery for most with risk of gales high terrain of England and north Wales.

Headline for Lake District

Frequent rain and largely foggy; windy, near gale

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 24 June, 2025

| How windy? (On the summits) | Westerly 30 to 40mph. Strongest sustained winds around midday and afternoon with possibly stronger gusts over highest tops. Very blustery over the fells, walking becoming arduous in places on exposed higher areas. Considerable wind chill. | |

| How wet? | Fairly persistent, particularly western fells | |
| (Precipitation and its impact) | Rain and drizzle fairly persistent west and southwest fells much of the day. Steadier rain in the morning for a few hours most areas. May fade to drizzly showers, small amounts east later in the day. | |
| Cloud on the hills? | Extensive | |
| | Shrouding the fells most likely all day, from mid-to-lower slopes up in west & southwest, some breaks above 600m east of Helvellyn. | |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | 10% | |
| Sunshine? | Largely cloudy, little or no sun. | |
| Air clarity (below cloud) | Visibility good below cloud, but often rather misty over fells, particularly west. | |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | 10 or 11C, little change if any all day. | |

| How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you? | Westerly, shifting southerly, 20 to 25mph, may reach 30mph at times higher tops. Stronger breezes around nightfall. Breezy over the fells, may start to affect balance on exposed ridges, some buffeting around high tops. | Westerly 25-35mph. Shifting southwesterly into evening and rising towards 40mph, further deteriorating after dark. Walking impeded in strongest winds, becoming arduous into evening. Marked wind chill. |
| How wet? | Drizzle mostly south, risk wetter later | Morning patchy rain, then mostly dry |
| (Precipitation and its impact) | Drizzly spots over south and southwest Lakeland, occasional drizzly showers further north. Toward evening, more persistent rain likely to develop from southwest. | Patchy rain in the morning fading. Fine drizzle may linger over high western tops for a time. Into night, risk of rain setting in again. |
| Cloud on the hills? | Lowest and most persistent south | Extensive at dawn, largely clearing |
| | Shrouding higher areas in south and southwest most of the day, some lower bases possible near coast. Occasional higher breaks, mostly above 700m and up to high tops north and northeast Lakes. Becoming extensive into evening. | Extensive at dawn, down to lowest slopes in the west. Breaking through morning for often cloud free fells. Cloud caps likely come and go on westernmost high fells. Risk of cloud becoming more extensive over high terrain again into evening. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | 30%, 60% northeast Lakeland | Becoming 90% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Glimpses of sun, best north/east Lakes. Visibility very good out of cloud. | Sun gradually becoming frequent through morning. Excellent visibility. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | 9C rising to 12C. Feeling like 4C in the wind, nearer freezing high tops in morning. | 10C at daybreak, cooling a degree after morning. Feeling near freezing in strongest wind. |

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 25 June, 2025

West to southwesterly winds prevail this week and a series of frontal systems come in from the Atlantic. Rain and drizzle most frequent in west with low cloud often covering hills, typically most extensive in Scotland. Higher cloud bases and drier further eastwards. Temperatures near average, or lower at times in Scotland. Often windy, risk of more extensive upland gales and some heavier rain as deeper areas of low pressure likely move in later in the week. Some indication of a brief settled spell into the weekend and rising temperatures, though northwest Scotland remaining at risk of frontal weather systems.
