

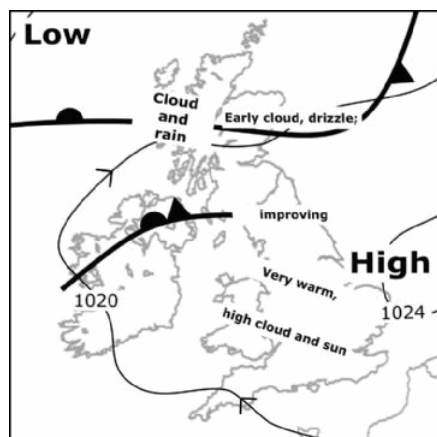
# Lake District

The entire Lake District National Park, taking in all major summits, including Scafell, Helvellyn, Skiddaw, the Langdales and Old Man of Conistone.



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## General Summary for Monday, 11 August, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 11 August, 2025

Morning cloud and patchy rain/drizzle around north England and Scotland, primarily in the west, with a blustery west-southwesterly. Conditions easing for most though west Scotland tends to remain foggy with rain towards northwest. South Pennines and Wales substantially dry with little cloud on hills; very warm here.

### Headline for Lake District

Morning drizzle and cloud; improving away from south/west

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 11 August, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwest, risk gusty 25-30mph at first. Easing to 15mph or less later in the day and trending southerly, though some variability.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Blustery start, may affect comfortable walking on high tops early in day, but likely to become mostly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Morning patchy drizzle, mostly west</b> Patchy drizzle, may stay persistently damp for several hours through morning where in cloud over western fells. Tending to fade to become dry into afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Low cloud mostly S/W in morning</b> Extensive to lowest south and west slopes at dawn, most other fells shrouded above 600m. Tending to thin and break, but risk clinging to southwest fells beyond midday. Further north & east, patches soon clearing, occasionally up to tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun and high cloud, visibility good, but some haze; locally mistier toward coasts and possibly further inland early morning.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	13C in the morning, locally cooler in cloud on western fells. Rising to 16C afternoon; feeling humid.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 12 August, 2025**

Very warm and humid over England and Wales in the first half of the week, this bringing a risk of thundery bursts of rain drifting northeastwards - these likely very local. Warm and humid air briefly extends across Scotland on Tuesday as well. Confidence in detail is low from Wednesday onward: risk of showers increasingly present from Wednesday evening through Thursday for many areas, which may produce heavy or thundery bursts and tending to stay warm. High pressure will rebuild from the north into the weekend, reducing the risk of rain and increasing the chance for sunny spells.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2025.
