








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General Summary for Saturday, 23 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 23 August, 2025

Cloudy skies for many places, varied areas of low cloud on some hill slopes in the morning, largely lifting above the tops, but may continue to cap higher western mountains in Scotland, with a little rain occasionally. An odd shower in north Wales in afternoon. Winds generally light.

Headline for Lake District

Largely dry, cloud mostly above hills; light winds.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 23 August, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable west becoming southerly, 5 to 10mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance an odd patch of drizzle around early low cloud. Small risk an isolated light shower afternoon.	
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly little or clearing	
	Patchy cloud may drift across some slopes in the morning. Most or all cloud likely soon above the hills.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon 90%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun and mostly thin high cloud. May start misty, visibility becoming excellent.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C from dawn. Rising to 14C afternoon.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly or variable 10 to 15mph, tending to increase a little western areas, gusts 20mph some slopes. Mostly small	Southerly, strengthening, 20-30mph, risk reaching 40mph higher fells particularly in west, in places very gusty. Increasingly blustery, affecting comfortable walking on exposed higher terrain, risk becoming more challenging high tops.
How wet?	Rain unlikely	Rain not expected until late
(Precipitation and its impact)	Small chance an isolated light shower.	Dry most or all day. Chance of odd spots from thickening high cloud. By evening or more likely into night, risk of steadier rain developing from southwest, may turn heavy.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly southwest tops	Little if any
	Cloud banks drifting onto some upper slopes for periods, mostly southwestern Lakes from Coniston to Scafell group.	Patchy cloud around some slopes in the morning, mostly near coast, lifting and dispersing to leave the fells clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun and some high cloud. Visibility good, but slight haze.	Sunshine and some high cloud moving in. Visibility good, possible slight haze.
How Cold? (at 750m)	11C from dawn, rising to 15C afternoon.	13 to 15C, warmest N/E Lakes. As the wind increases, feeling below 5C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 24 August, 2025

High pressure drifts slowly east, whilst low pressure over the Atlantic encroaches nearer in the early part of the new week. Southeasterly winds increasing Sunday-Monday, soonest for western regions, becoming much windier by Monday in west, then more widely with time. Areas of rain and showery bursts increasingly widespread as the week progresses as low pressure then rotates slowly over Britain - day-to-day detail becomes very uncertain. Warmer and more humid for a time, then cooler later in week.

Forecast issued at 16:30 on Friday, 22 August, 2025
