

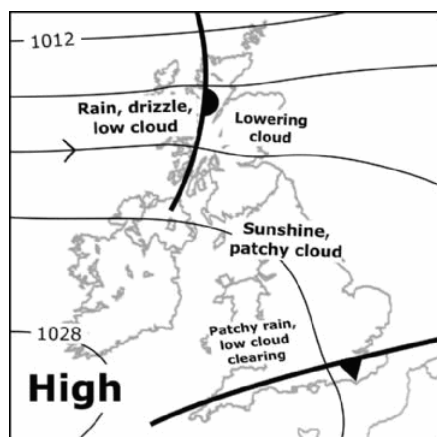
Lake District

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General Summary for Wednesday, 8 October, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 8 October, 2025

Strong westerly winds across Scotland, increasingly gale-force over the mountains. Wet and murky in western Scotland all day. Further eastwards, smaller amounts of rain and drizzle, higher cloud bases, but tending to lower. Dry and bright for England & Wales much of the day, with moderate breezes.

Headline for Lake District

Breezy on tops. Largely dry, patchy cloud high tops.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 8 October, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 20 to 25mph. Reaching 30mph toward evening, then 35mph into night.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small effect on walking, but feeling blustery over exposed higher fells. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Generally dry Chance of an odd drizzly shower, mostly western fells later in the day.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly higher and western tops Patchy cloud in the morning, mostly above 700m and in western areas. Patches may come and go over higher tops all day, but good breaks in eastern areas. During afternoon, tending to more often cap higher fells.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70% dropping to 50% later
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun in morning, best in east. Cloudier afternoon. Very good visibility, some haze later.
How Cold? (at 750m)	5 or 6C. Feeling below freezing in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 9 October, 2025

Pressure gradually rises from the south later this week, improving conditions toward the weekend as wind drops lighter, most places become dry and cloud tends to break. Northwest Scotland holds on to stronger winds, cloud and some drizzle into Saturday. Scope for inversion conditions to develop with some valley fog and varied low cloud. Settled weather is likely to continue into next week, with mostly light winds, pleasant days and cool nights.
