

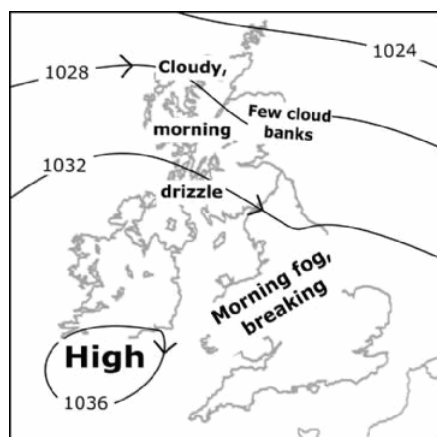
# Lake District

## General Summary for Friday, 10 October, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 10 October, 2025

Drizzly and cloudy in west Scotland, dry with well broken cloud to the east; strong gusty winds central and northern Scotland. Morning low cloud fairly extensive across England, largely clearing the Pennines - Lakeland fells will struggle to clear. A foggy start in Wales with drizzle on west slopes; breaks to many tops forming.

### Headline for Lake District

Mostly cloudy, some morning drizzle; gusty

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 10 October, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly 15 to 25mph, often gusty around higher fells and elevated passes.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small some areas, but blustery around higher slopes and passes, gusts may affect balance on ridges.
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Largely dry</b> Fine drizzle in the morning over the high tops, some local pockets toward west Lakes.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, some improvement east</b> Banks of cloud above 500-700m, lowest and most persistent western fells, but in places fog to lower elevations early in day. Tending to thin with some breaks, best in the east.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20% rising to 40% afternoon.</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun developing, some more extended bursts possible later in the day east. Hazy or misty start, improving visibility with time.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	7 to 8C, little change with added height to higher summits. Feeling just above freezing in the wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## Lake District - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northwesterly 10-15mph, easing to a variable 10mph or less afternoon.  <b>Mostly small</b>	Variable or easterly 10-15mph, at times less. Some gustiness over high tops and elevated passes.  <b>Small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>          <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Fog or low cloud, higher afternoon</b>  Varied fog from dawn, in some valleys, but also banks of cloud on some hill slopes; higher tops at or above cloud tops. Cloud patches then mostly drifting higher up above 700m middle of day, well broken south and eastern fells.  <b>50% (tops perhaps above cloud)</b>	<b>Morning low fog dissipates for clear fells</b>  Patchy fog in the valleys from dawn, this lifting onto low and middle slopes after sunrise though mostly dissipating for largely clear fells.  <b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, occasional sun, best east. Visibility good, some haze or mist in morning.	A patchwork of cloud and sun most of the day. Excellent visibility, though some haze will linger around low slopes.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	7 to 9C; little change with height in morning, some lower slopes start cooler.  Above the summits	9 to 11C. Increasing temperature with height.  Above the summits

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 11 October, 2025

Westerly winds with some drizzle over high ground prevails in northern Scotland into Saturday, then high pressure establishes over the British Isles bringing light winds and dry weather conditions well into next week. Scope for inversion conditions this weekend and early next week with some valley fog and varied low cloud. Into the week, mixed cloud and sun with occasional longer spells of cloud or sunshine. Easterly winds are expected to increase with time for England and Wales, particularly in the south where there could be notable gusts over high terrain. Pleasant daytime temperatures, some cooler nights with slight frost where skies are clear.
