

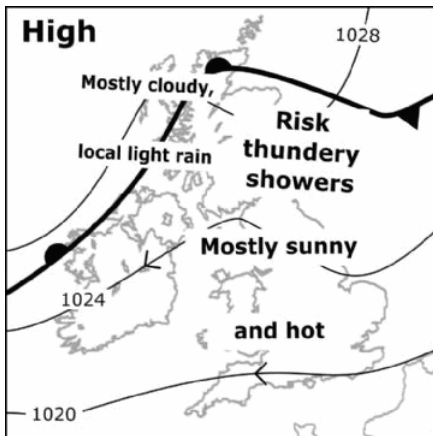
# Lake District

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## General Summary for Saturday, 11 July, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2026

Fairly cloudy Scottish highlands, drizzly tops east where a risk of thundery showers; drier west, local bright breaks. A rising risk of heavy/thundery showers forming over Southern Uplands. Very warm and sunny in England, but high cloud and a risk of showers far north later. Extensive hot sunshine for Wales.

Very warm; a risk of showers later with a breeze building

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 11 July, 2026

<p><b>How windy? (On the summits)</b></p> <p><b>Effect of wind on you?</b></p>	<p>Easterly 10-15mph; notable variability in the morning with speeds largely below 10mph. Tending to strengthen late in the day into nighttime, sustained speeds to 20mph over tops with stronger gusts.</p> <p><b>Small most of the day; if showers occur, notably gusty, affecting ease of walking.</b></p>
<p><b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p><b>Rising risk heavy showers</b></p> <p>The morning is likely dry, then a rising risk of pop-up showers through afternoon. Some risk of these becoming locally very heavy, clustering later in the day and into night, but tending to fade overnight.</p>
<p><b>Cloud on the hills?</b></p> <p><b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b></p>	<p><b>Little or none</b></p> <p>Small risk of a few odd patches forming on the high tops if showers occur, but the fells more likely cloud-free.</p> <p><b>Above 90%</b></p>
<p><b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Largely sunny but weakened by high cloud, which tends to thicken at least in the north.</p> <p>Excellent visibility.</p>
<p><b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b></p> <p><b>Freezing Level</b></p>	<p>17 to 19C, some variability, and may locally rise to 20C, most likely southwest fells.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

	<b>Sunday 12 July</b>	<b>Monday 13 July</b>
<p><b>How windy? (On the summits)</b></p> <p><b>Effect of wind on you?</b></p>	<p>Easterly 15-20mph; notable gusts over tops, particularly early when pushing downslope as well.</p> <p><b>Fairly small.</b></p>	<p>Easterly 10-15mph, frequent gusts over tops and elevated passes, pushing downslope early and late.</p> <p><b>Fairly small, but nuisance gusts common over high terrain most of the day.</b></p>
<p><b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p><b>Likely dry</b></p> <p>Small chance of a few spots of rain here and there in the morning, but the fells more likely entirely dry.</p>	<p><b>No rain expected</b></p>
<p><b>Cloud on the hills?</b></p> <p><b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b></p>	<p><b>Early variable patches dissipate</b></p> <p>Ribbons of cloud drift onto east fells from time to time through morning, mostly above 600m; a few caps over high western tops, but many western fells clear of cloud. Cloud soon dissipates for clear fells.</p> <p><b>Soon rising to 80%</b></p>	<p><b>Likely none</b></p> <p>Small chance of a few ribbons of cloud on eastern fells below the summits, these soon lifting and dissipating in the early morning for clear fells.</p> <p><b>Above 90%</b></p>
<p><b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>A patchwork of cloud and sunshine, sun increasingly extensive.</p> <p>Very good visibility.</p>	<p>Extensive sunshine.</p> <p>Very good visibility.</p>
<p><b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b></p> <p><b>Freezing Level</b></p>	<p>13C rising to 16C, locally 17C on western fells.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>	<p>13C rising to 17 or 18C, warmest western fells.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 12 July, 2026**

Staying very warm late weekend into next week. High pressure north of the country keeps the skies mostly clear and facilitates an easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures to western hill groups. Northeastern areas will see early sea fog under the high pressure, this dissipating in the sun through morning. Scottish highlands seeing temperatures often rise into the mid-teens, valley temperatures to the 20s west; warmest Wales where hill temperatures often to 20C or higher. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Low pressure south of the country may push cloud and showers into Wales, though confidence remains low, and could remain largely dry. Detail uncertain later next week, but a milder northerly flow may begin to establish.
