

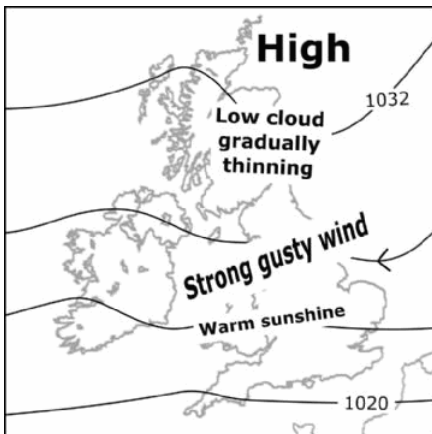
Lake District

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General Summary for Sunday, 12 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 12 July, 2026

Cloud shrouds many hills in Scotland and NE England in the morning, more broken westwards; slowly tending to thin to leave patchier cloud on higher tops mainly eastern Scotland by afternoon. A notably strong gusty easterly wind for England & Wales, but mostly sunny. Warm for Wales & Peak District.

Headline for Lake District

Breezy, some strong gusts. Mostly sunny.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 12 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 15 to 25mph; notable gusts over tops, particularly early when pushing downslope as well, in places 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but some gusty spots more noticeable when walking on exposed terrain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Early variable patches dissipate Ribbons of cloud drift onto east fells from time to time through morning, mostly above 600m; a few caps over high western tops, but many western fells clear of cloud all day. Cloud soon dissipates for clear fells.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon rising above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of cloud and sunshine, sun increasingly extensive. Very good visibility. High UV, beware sunburn.
How Cold? (at 750m)	11 to 13C in morning, rising to 15C, locally 17C on western fells. Feeling like 5C directly in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Lake District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 13 July	Tuesday 14 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly 10-15mph, frequent gusts over tops and elevated passes, pushing downslope early and late. Fairly small, but nuisance gusts common over high terrain most of the day.	Easterly 15 to 25mph, local gusts 30mph around some upper slopes, strongest speeds not necessarily on summits. Breezy over the fells, in places gustiness may start to affect comfortable walking, feeling cooler where exposed.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Likely none Small chance of a few ribbons of cloud on eastern fells below the summits, these soon lifting and dissipating in the early morning for clear fells. Above 90%	Mostly clear, early patches Patchy fog in some valleys and patches of cloud clinging to some hill slopes in east and north Lakes, brief fragments drift over tops, but all dispersing for clear fells, many areas clear all day. 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine. Very good visibility.	Mostly sunny, some patchy cloud in east early in day. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	13C rising to 17 or 18C, warmest western fells. Above the summits.	13C from dawn, 10C if in cloud on some slopes toward east and north, rising to 18C (valleys reach 25C). Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 13 July, 2026

A fine week of summer weather - warm and dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. High pressure north of the country keeps the skies mostly clear, some low-level cloud rolling inland from the North Sea at times. A prevailing easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures to western hill groups, valley temperatures often 25C, or warmer for Wales and Peak District, at times 30C. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Notably dry ground conditions, beware very high fire risk. Later in the week, an increasing risk of thundery showers forming, with a cooling trend into the weekend 18-19th.
