

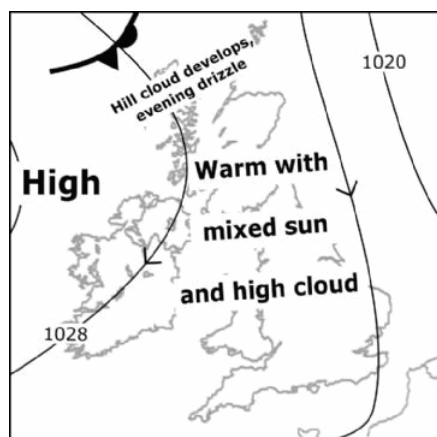
Lake District

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General Summary for Sunday, 19 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 19 July, 2026

Some patchy mist here and there at dawn, but the hills largely clear with a mix of sun and high cloud across the country. Mostly warm, milder north Scotland where cloud patches graze highest tops. Late in the day, hill cloud arrives into northwest Scotland with light drizzly rain. Fire risk remains high.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 19 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 10mph, often less, but some occasional stronger breezes over high tops too.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Fells clear Chance a few pockets of fine mist in sheltered areas just at dawn, this soon fading for clear fells.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny, mixed with thin high cloud and patchy fair weather cloud. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9 or 10C rising to 14C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 5-15mph, some variability, some gusty sea-breezes may form on slopes nearest to coasts.	Northwesterly 10 to 20mph, increasing a little during day.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Largely dry Small chance of a brief light shower, mainly further eastwards in the afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Fells clear Patchy mist affects fells at various heights in the morning, this soon lifting and fading for clear fells.	Capping some tops, largely clearing Patches of cloud briefly grazing some upper slopes in the morning, may come and go on west and northwest high tops for a few hours, but likely all lifting above tops.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain	60% rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of cloud and sun. Very good visibility.	Patchwork of cloud and sun. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	12C rising to 16C.	13C, rising to 15C afternoon inland and eastern fells.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 20 July, 2026

Weather remains settled through next week as high pressure persists west of Ireland . Northwesterly flow keep temperatures nearer to average for the time of year, dawn temperatures in the middle single digits in Scotland; staying warm in England and Wales but maximum summit temperatures only to the high teens . Cloud and drizzle starts to affect northwest Scotland more often, occasionally drifting further south, chance of an area of patchy rain slipping south through the country on Wednesday, though totals likely small. Despite this, ground remains very dry with high fire risk, with active wildfires limiting access in places. An unsettling trend is indicated next following weekend, bringing wind and rain first to Scotland and increasingly widely. England and Wales may remain quite warm .
