

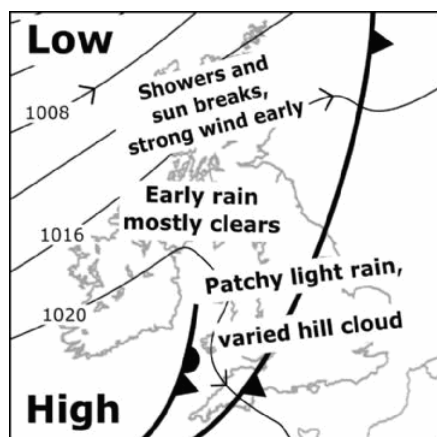
Lake District

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General Summary for Friday, 25 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 25 September, 2026

Windy in Scotland, showers west, only scattered eastward where often sunny; wind lessens for a time afternoon. Patchy rain England and Wales, tending to break up in north England later. Rain and cloud linger in Wales and south Pennines but rainfall totals small; mild-to-warm, little wind in Wales.

Headline for Lake District

Morning rain increasingly breaks up, dry and bright later

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 25 September, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly 15 to 25mph, speed likely to vary during the day. Later, settling southwesterly, strengthening overnight.
Effect of wind on you?	Variable, sometimes fairly small, but periods where feeling blustery and rather cool in exposure on high terrain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Early rain mostly clears to just light patches Rain starting overnight stays fairly persistent for a time early morning for west and southern areas, but tending to break up and fade to just occasional rain or a light shower. Northern fells likely become dry later in the day.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive then rising, fells increasingly clearing Shrouding the fells at first above 600-800m, lowest west and southern fells, some lower banks for a time. Rising bases to upper slopes, good higher breaks form with time, above many tops north/east, little remaining later.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% rising to 60%, or later 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy morning, brighter skies breaking out and some weak sun afternoon. Visibility starts poor west/southwest; improving during day to mostly good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C just at dawn, soon nearer to 7 or 8C with little change the rest of the day. Feeling near to 0C in stronger wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 26 September, 2026

South to southwesterly winds prevail onward into the weekend and next week. Saturday will be bright for many, windy in Scotland with some showers in the west. Mild-to-warm temperatures, but a chilly feeling north in wind. A band of rain sweeps eastward more broadly on Sunday; rain could be very heavy for a few afternoon hours. A window of higher pressure is indicated for Monday with warmer, brighter conditions for many, but northwest Scotland starts breezy with cloud and some light rain. Into mid-next week, risk of a more widespread gale, or severe gale over higher mountains. Detail of timing is uncertain, but several bands of rain punctuated by showers and bright spells will likely cross most mountain areas. Unseasonably warm temperatures. The weather stays mixed into early October.
