

The Northwest Highlands

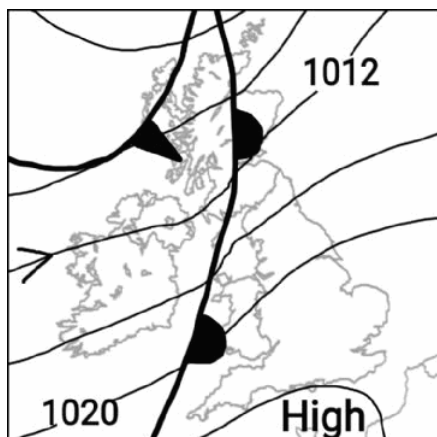

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General Summary for Wednesday, 26 November, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 26 November, 2025

Scotland: Southerly gales with hill fog extend east to become very extensive with rain and drizzle; transient snow upper slopes.

England and Wales: Strengthening southerly winds with hills filling in with low cloud with patchy rain and drizzle.

Headline for The Northwest Highlands

Hill fog becoming extensive from west with rain, transient snow tops. Gales for a time.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 26 November, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to south-westerly 40 to 55mph morning. Will veer west and ease, perhaps to or below 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Some easing through day, but extensively difficult walking where exposed with powerful gusts and considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain and drizzle on and off Rain and drizzle (snow above 800m temporarily). The rain rarely ceasing for several hours western mountains south from Wester Ross, but on and off elsewhere. Generally less wet afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Very extensive western mountains, tending to lower elsewhere. Many higher slopes initially cloud free, perhaps all morning hills toward Ben Hope and Ben Wyvis. Will deteriorate, on western mountains south from Wester Ross, cloud forming from lower slopes up. Elsewhere, slowly filling in across higher slopes, typically 500 to 800m afternoon.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Dropping to 10%, but 60% for a time in north.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Little or no sunshine: extensively dull and misty as visibility drops in rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	-1C rising to 2C through daylight. Will feel as cold as minus 14C directly in the wind.
Freezing Level	800m at first; rising abruptly above the summits, in most areas during morning.
