

The Northwest Highlands

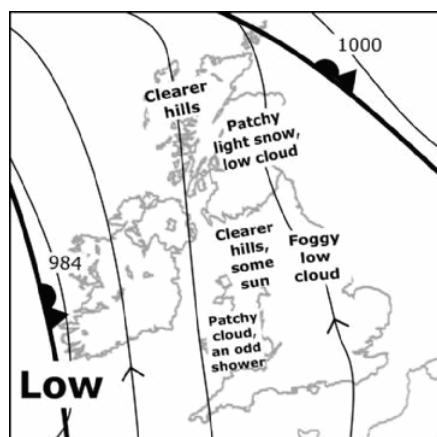

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General Summary for Wednesday, 28 January, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 28 January, 2026

A fairly quiet day with plenty of dry weather and some good cloud breaks toward the west and northwest of major hill groups. Some snow flurries and low cloud lingers over the Cairngorms to SE Highlands. Moderate S-SE wind, locally gusty.

Headline for The Northwest Highlands

Largely dry, cloud breaks west & north. Gusty in places.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 28 January, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to southeasterly, overnight gales easing through to dawn, soon 20-25mph most areas, locally less, but near Ben Hope risk gusty 35mph for longer into day. Some gusty spots over 30mph on Skye, tending to increase here later.
Effect of wind on you?	Soon mostly fairly small effect on walking, but some local sudden gusty areas not necessarily on highest terrain may be noticeable, feeling chilly particularly in exposure on Cuillin.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Most or all day dry except far northeast Rain locally around dawn, some snow on high tops mainly inland. Soon fading, leaving most of day dry. Locally in east north of Dornoch Firth, light rain and wet snow on highest tops.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little west coast, varied inland Covering easternmost hills much of day to mid-slopes, though tending to lift around Ben Wyvis. More broken and higher cloud westwards, many coastal hills largely clear. Some patches drift onto south Cuillin occasionally.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	50% inland, to 70% west coastal hills.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun mostly west coast, often weak through high cloud. Visibility very good west, more haze toward east coast.
How Cold? (at 900m)	0 or +1C. Wind chill feeling like -7C in stronger speeds locally on tops.
Freezing Level	800 to 1000m, but just above freezing on many west coastal higher slopes. Patchy frost some glens from dawn.

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 29 January, 2026

Slow-moving weather patterns and a broadly similar regime to recent times over the next week or so. Scottish mountains generally below freezing point, with snow cover and drifts most substantial from the Cairngorms to central and southern Highlands, some additional falls in the week ahead, much less northwestward. Hills in England and Wales will see varying freezing levels, sub-zero for periods to 600m or lower, but intermittently lifting just above the tops - a mix of rain and upland snowfall. Wind speed will vary, some periods of lower speeds than recently, though gusty SE'ly winds remain common in the Highlands. Scope for widely colder conditions toward mid February.

Forecast issued at 16:30 on Tuesday, 27 January, 2026
