

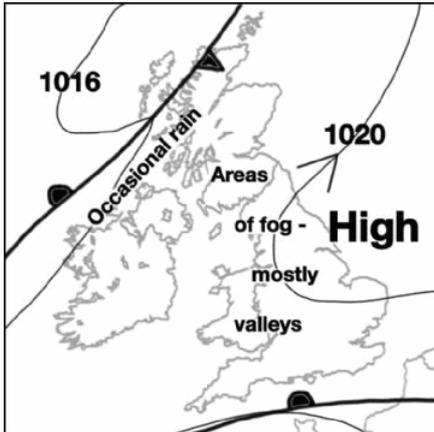
Peak District

General Summary for Friday, 27 November, 2020



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 27 November, 2020

A little rain Scottish Highlands, and mainly near the west coast low cloud. Elsewhere, dry, but fog wise very varied conditions. Fog in many valleys thins only slowly - if at all. On the hills, cloud often covering higher tops near N Irish Sea, otherwise tops often cloud free.

Headline for Peak District

Hardly any wind; fog lower slopes. Dry.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 27 November, 2020

How windy? (On the summits)	Direction varied, 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Precipitation unlikely
Cloud on the hills?	Most summits cloud free Areas of fog or very low cloud in and above many valleys, persisting all day in some places. Top of this fog mostly below 300 or 400m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine extensive and visibility excellent on higher areas In and above valleys, murky or foggy.
Temperature (at 600m)	1C.
And in the valleys	Widespread frost after dawn; will rise to between 3 and 6C middle of day or early afternoon.

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly 5 to 15mph.	Direction varied 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	A little light rain here and there Pockets of light rain, although substantially dry.	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive most or all day Confidence in the detail low: Some summits may start cloud free - above lower cloud. But the fog will probably fill in on higher areas, although will gradually thin on above lower slopes.	Higher areas cloud free A mix of fog and mist on lower slopes, most extensive morning. But either throughout daylight, or increasingly from the south, above 300 to perhaps 500m, the hills above the cloud.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine breaking through in some areas, but overall extensive low cloud and misty or murky.	Foggy, misty or murky lower slopes, especially morning. Superb visibility probable higher slopes.
Temperature (at 600m)	3C.	6C
And in the valleys	Frost extensive at dawn. Rising toward 5C during day.	Slight frost some valleys after dawn; 7 to 9C early afternoon.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 28 November, 2020**

Very much drier over the coming week, although weakening fronts will bring a little rain and pulses of strong winds, mainly to the NW Highlands. Elsewhere, winds light and although extensively dry, fog will be widespread in and above valleys whilst higher up many summits become cloud free.

Temperature wise, the odd brief incursion of sub-freezing air onto higher summits Scottish Highlands, but any sustained cold at least a week off. Frost in valleys mostly confined to England and particularly Wales.
