

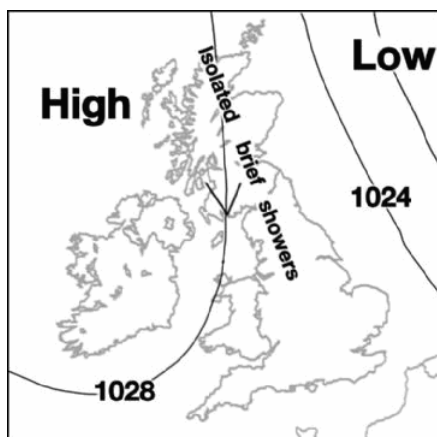
# Peak District

## General Summary for Saturday, 28 May, 2022



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 28 May, 2022**

Extensively dry with patches of sun, although a few brief showers. However, it will remain chilly, particularly near the coast of NW Scotland, where higher areas will be below freezing point.

Risk of a shower. Light wind.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 28 May, 2022

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northerly, 15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small.
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Isolated showers</b> A few brief showers afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little if any</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Almost certain</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Bright sunshine until late morning, then more cloudy. Visibility excellent.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	5C rising to 9C. Will feel much colder directly in the wind.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Around 16C in the afternoon

## Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 29 May	Monday 30 May
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northerly, 15 to 20mph, perhaps 25mph at times on higher moors, particularly eastern areas. <b>Fairly small</b>	Direction may well vary, mostly less than 15mph, perhaps calm on some summits. <b>Mostly negligible.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Showers, mainly afternoon</b> Risk of a few showers from dawn. From late morning or midday, a scattering of showers more widely, giving hail on higher tops. Small risk isolated thunder.	<b>Areas of showers developing</b> Risk showers here and there from dawn. Showers may become more widespread, possibly heavy with small risk thunder, from late morning.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little if any</b>	<b>Mostly very little</b>  Cloud base will rise above the summits a few hours after dawn, although fragments may return near showers.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun, but cloud filling in by afternoon. Visibility excellent.	Patches of sunshine will tend to give way to occasional bursts of sun. Often excellent visibility but poor in rain.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b> <b>And in the valleys</b>	4C rising to 8C. Wind chill will feel near or below 0C in the morning.  Around 5C in sheltered valleys at dawn, rising to 13 to 15C.	6C.  3 to 5C post dawn with ground frost in some valleys and sheltered upland dips. Will reach 14 or 15C in the afternoon.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 29 May, 2022**

Relatively low temperatures on the mountains much of next week; particularly on the Scottish highlands where higher tops will frequently be near freezing point. Showers, some heavy and thundery, giving hail and on higher tops snow, will be widespread, particularly in the afternoons, when in some areas they will merge to give a few hours of precipitation.
