


Peak District

General Summary for Saturday, 6 August, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 6 August, 2022

A warm front passes eastwards across Scotland, bringing cloud, some rain or drizzle. The northwest stays damp, but areas toward central Scotland will become brighter. Thickening cloud over hills of northern England and a little drizzle. Dry and fairly sunny for Wales.

Headline for Peak District

Dry, often sunny, moderate breeze. Beware sunburn.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 6 August, 2022

How windy? (On the summits)	West or northwesterly 15mph, or 20mph higher terrain early morning.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but breezy where exposed on tops and feeling cool in the morning.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	Generally clear Rare if any fragments of cloud briefly drifting onto higher western slopes in the morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and thin high cloud, some fair-weather cloud filling in for a time. Visibility excellent.
Temperature (at 600m)	9C rising to 14C.
And in the valleys	Cool start, below 10C in many valleys at dawn. Rising to 20 to 22C, warmest south and eastern Peak.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 7 August	Monday 8 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly, 10 to 15mph, but may be 20mph just around dawn.	Direction variable, mostly less than 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	Very little, all clearing Rare patches on some western slopes early morning, but soon drifting above the hills or generally dispersing.	Hills clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	80% becoming almost certain.	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and fair-weather cloud, which may cover the sky for periods then thinning. Visibility very good.	Strong sunshine; a little fair-weather cloud building. Visibility excellent.
Temperature (at 600m)	12C rising to 17C.	13C rising to 17C.
And in the valleys	Around 10C at dawn, rising to 22 to 25C by early afternoon, warmest south and eastern Peak.	Below 10C at dawn, rising to 23 to 25C.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 7 August, 2022**

Southwesterly winds continue to influence Scotland into next week. Rain or drizzle will be most frequent in the Northwest Highlands, where low cloud will often shroud coastal hills. Winds strengthening at times toward gale force on the tops. Further south and east across Scotland, it will be commonly dry with higher cloud bases, becoming warmer and more humid with time. High pressure extends across England and Wales, leading to a settled outlook for the week ahead here, generally dry with light winds, becoming increasingly warm or very warm, particularly in southern areas.
