

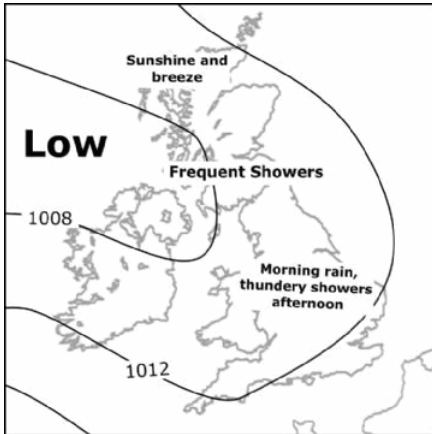
# Peak District

## General Summary for Sunday, 26 May, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 26 May, 2024

Low pressure system drifting from the Atlantic brings unstable weather, lot of clouds, frequent showers and more than occasional thunderstorms, especially in northern England. Strong gusts are expected by thunderstorms, especially in Welsh mountains and in Peak District. Best conditions likely in Northwest Highlands.

### Headline for Peak District

Frequent rain, partly thundery. Gusty.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 26 May, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southerly 10 to 20mph, increasing during the day to 25mph. Locally thunderstorm-induced downdrafts with gusts up to 40mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small, may start to feel blustery. In thunderstorm vicinity walking impeded at times.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Drizzle start, later thundery showers.</b> Drizzle or light rain in the morning. Briefly dry before noon, from noon on widely developing, likely thundery showers, lasting till the evening.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills covered extensively, afternoon slowly lifting.</b> Clouds covering hills from start, slowly lifting, uncovering some areas in the afternoon. Returning clouds possible if a thunderstorm occurs.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10% rising to 40%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly dull, chance for few sunbeams through the clouds in the afternoon between the showers. Poor visibility, improving if clouds lift.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	9 to 11C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	9C at dawn, rising to 15C.

**Peak District - Looking Ahead**

	<b>Monday 27 May</b>	<b>Tuesday 28 May</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly, 15 to locally 30mph.	Southwesterly 20 to 30mph
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small at start, starting to affect comfortable walking in the afternoon.</b>	<b>Be prepared for fairly blustery conditions through the day with some buffeting.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Drizzle start, later only isolated showers.</b> Possible drizzle or light rain in the morning locally, but more often dry. Afternoon brief, isolated showers.	<b>Rain breaking up into heavy showers.</b> A front will progress northeast bringing periods of rain and drizzle, before tending to break up into areas of showery and at times heavy rain, risk of thunder.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Morning mostly covered, later often clearing.</b> Hills often covered at start, lifting during the day, often clearing the tops.	<b>Likely covering the hills for several hours.</b> Be prepared for cloud to cover high slopes, and perhaps to mid slopes for a time through morning. Bases may lift off the tops at times in the afternoon, away from any rain.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20%, later 80%</b>	<b>50%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Some sunshine through the clouds coming in the afternoon, most likely on the southernmost Peaks. Good visibility.	Mostly overcast morning, but should front move through, scope for some sunshine for a time, before further cloud forms. Visibility good at times, poor in rain.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	7 to 9C. As wind strengthens will feel like 2C on highest terrain.	8C rising to 11C, but feeling nearer 5C in the wind on higher tops.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	8C at dawn, rising to 13 to 15C.	7C at dawn, rising to 14 to 16C

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 27 May, 2024**

Bank Holiday is likely to stay wet in Scotland and northern England, with widely spread showers from the Highlands to the Lakes. Occasional showers may also sweep across Pennines and Snowdonia. Warm front from the west coming on Tuesday brings more persistent, but usually less intense rain. Following this, a northerly flow and high pressure building from the west, brings optimism for improving conditions and sunnier end of the week, while temperatures likely staying similar or even dropping slightly.
