

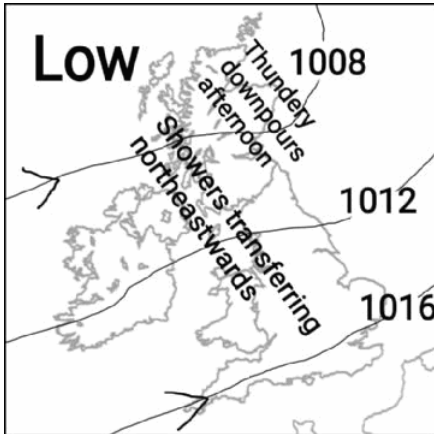
# Peak District

## General Summary for Monday, 27 May, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 27 May, 2024

Low pressure to northwest, brings an unstable southwesterly with clusters of rain or showers in the west, heaviest on the coast, transferring northeastwards through the day. This will allow an afternoon improvement in the west, whilst a focus of heavy downpours and thunderstorms will affect the east and northeast.

### Headline for Peak District

Clusters of showers moving through morning. Drier afternoon. Breezy.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 27 May, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly, 15 to locally 30mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small at start, starting to affect comfortable walking in the afternoon.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Showers moving in, some heavy. Drier afternoon.</b> Clusters of showers moving across area through morning, some heavy, before clearing to the northeast. Then, afternoon brief, isolated showers.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Morning mostly covered, later often clearing.</b> Hills often covered at start, lifting during the day, often clearing the tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20% in morning, 80% into afternoon</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Some sunshine through the clouds coming in the afternoon, most likely on the southernmost Peaks. Good visibility.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	7 to 9C. As wind strengthens will feel like 2C on highest terrain.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	8C at dawn, rising to 13 to 15C.

**Peak District - Looking Ahead**

	<b>Tuesday 28 May</b>	<b>Wednesday 29 May</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 20 to 30mph	Southwesterly later northwesterly 15 to 25mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Be prepared for fairly blustery conditions through the day with some buffeting.</b>	<b>Breezy with some buffeting possible at times.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain breaking up into heavy showers.</b> A front will progress northeast bringing periods of rain and drizzle, before tending to break up into areas of showery and at times heavy rain, risk of thunder.	<b>Areas of rain and showers, risk thunder.</b> Areas of rain and showers, will tend to develop further through the morning, with the risk of downpours and isolated thunderstorms in the afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Likely covering the hills for several hours.</b> Be prepared for cloud to cover high slopes, and perhaps to mid slopes for a time through morning. Bases may lift off the tops at times in the afternoon, away from any rain.	<b>Fairly extensive, but bases slowly rising.</b> Fairly extensive hill fog covering the hills, at varying heights. Gradual lift in bases through day, to higher slopes, some breaks, but patches to lower slopes in any downpours.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>50%</b>	<b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly overcast morning, but should front move through, scope for some sunshine for a time, before further cloud forms. Visibility good at times, poor in rain.	Often cloudy, with limited breaks in cloud and thus sunshine. Visibility good at times, but poor in rain.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	8C rising to 11C, but feeling nearer 5C in the wind on higher tops.	9C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	7C at dawn, rising to 14 to 16C	14 to 16C

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 28 May, 2024**

Tuesday will see unsettled conditions prevail with spells of rain moving in from the southwest courtesy of a warm front. Uncertainty on northward extent, but heavy showers may develop over the Highlands. Wednesday will see frequent areas of heavy showers or local thunderstorms, western coastal hills best. Then scope for drier conditions to develop as a ridge of high pressure moves in from the west, bringing a north to northwest flow. Low cloud and drizzly showers likely NW Scotland.
