

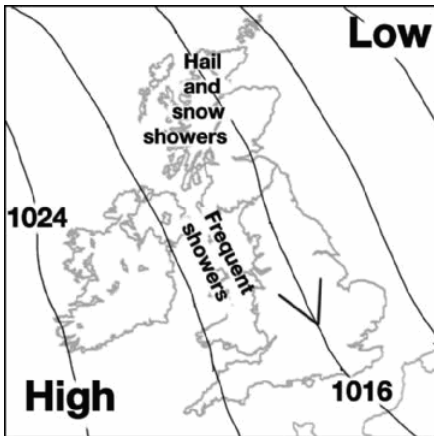
# Peak District

## General Summary for Thursday, 12 September, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 12 September, 2024**

Very cold for September; hail and snow in showers across the mountains in Scotland, and hail and sleet highest tops Snowdon range (where precipitation frequent). Elsewhere, a few brief showers and frequent bright sunshine. Nevertheless, feeling well below freezing point across the mountains directly in the wind.

### Headline for Peak District

Risk of a brief shower. Feeling very cold in the wind.

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 12 September, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northwesterly, 20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small.
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Little or no rain</b> Overnight showers may persist until afternoon, but soon confined to westernmost Peak District, then clearing. In afternoon one or two brief showers.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little if any by mid morning</b> Western hills in Peak District may take a few hours to clear; otherwise hills free of cloud.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sun. Excellent visibility.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	4 rising to 8C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Slight frost some valleys at dawn; will rise to 13 to 16C in afternoon.

## Peak District - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West backing southwesterly, 10mph. Strengthening in the evening.	Southwesterly typically 25mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly negligible</b>	<b>Mostly fairly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain very unlikely</b>	<b>Rain unlikely</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very little</b>  Cloud covering some higher slopes after dawn will lift above the summits within a few hours.	<b>Mostly or all clearing</b>  Fog across the hills after dawn will become confined to higher tops through morning. By afternoon, cloud confined above 600m .
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunny periods, before later sun weakening through higher cloud. Excellent visibility.	Patches of sun increasingly coming through. Visibility very good.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	5C rising to 10C.	11C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Frost at dawn in some valleys. Will reach 16C in afternoon.	17 to perhaps 19C in the afternoon.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 13 September, 2024**

Turning warmer from the weekend. Very little rain for a week to ten days (perhaps longer) for England and Wales, but in Scotland, particularly western mountains, rain (mainly Saturday and Monday - although the precise timing uncertain), Around Tuesday the fine warm water will extend across Scotland.
