

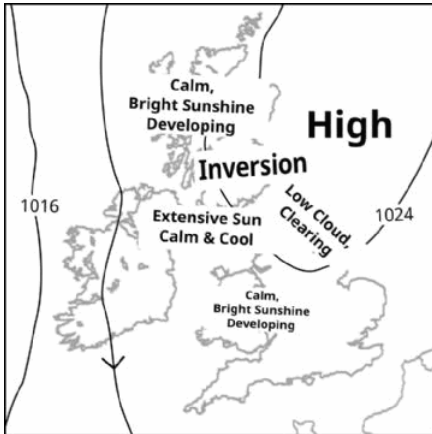
# Peak District

## General Summary for Thursday, 3 October, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 3 October, 2024**

Widely dry and sunny, inversion means often clear skies above the sea of clouds sitting in the valleys, this low cloud mostly dissipating by noon. Light winds, locally breezy along the western coast. Cool.

### Headline for Peak District

Largely dry, clear skies above low cloud covering valleys

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 3 October, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Variable, 5 to 15, perhaps locally 20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small or negligible.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely</b> An odd, brief shower is not fully ruled out, but unlikely.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Tops clear, valleys partly under low cloud</b> Patches of fog or very low cloud in some valleys possible especially east of river Derwent, but except for the lower slopes hills likely clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Lot of sunshine with some fair weather clouds. Valleys covered by low cloud in the morning. Very good visibility.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	9 or 10C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	6C at dawn rising to 15C

## Peak District - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southerly, 20 to 30mph.	Southwest to southeasterly, starting 20-25mph, strengthening to 30-35mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Blustery, walking impeded on higher terrain, stability beginning to be affected. Marked wind chill.</b>	<b>Walking becoming strenuous, wind may affect stability on high tops. Marked wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Low cloud in valleys, tops likely clear</b>  Fog or low cloud in some valleys, tops widely above the cloud. Fog dissipating during the morning.	<b>Clear, morning fog patches</b>  In the morning fog patches in some valleys. Later hills likely clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>80%</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Morning low cloud in the east and south, later sunny everywhere.  Good visibility but slight haze possible.	Mix of sun and clouds.  Good visibility with slight haze.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	7 to 9C, feeling much colder in wind.	Around 8C. Wind chill may reduce the perceived temperature to 0C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	5C at dawn, rising to 14C	8C at dawn, a bit more western dales. Rising to 14C

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 4 October, 2024**

On Friday in western Scotland deteriorating conditions, beware of upland gales in the Highlands. Lowering pressure and southwesterly winds toward the weekend bring an unsettled spell- rain at times, briefly milder air. Gradually cooling through next week, with spells of showery rain. On Thursday most likely widespread moderate to heavy rain, fairly persistent most mountains. Toward the weekend improving conditions, Saturday and Sunday probably dry and sunny.
