General Summary for Sunday, 13 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 July, 2025

Very warm across the mountains from overnight, soon feeling hot in morning sun. Some valleys again approaching 30C by early afternoon, though mostly slightly less hot than Saturday. A veil of high cloud tending to weaken the sun. Local gusty E-SE'ly winds. Generally dry, later a chance of very isolated showers.

Headline for Peak District

Very warm, sun and increasing high cloud, gusty in places.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 13 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 15-20mph. Breezier in the morning, local gusts 25mph downslope in the west.

How windy? (On the summits)	South turning southwesterly 15 to 25mph, speeds tending to increase, suddenly gusty 30mph for periods.	Southwesterly 25 to 30mph with stronger gusts at times on higher moors.
Effect of wind on you?	Increasingly affecting comfortable walking on exposed terrain, buffeting gusts.	Blustery across the hills, affecting comfortable walking where exposed, in places more strenuous.
How wet?	Thunderstorms likely	Rain frequent; heavy, risk thunder
(Precipitation and its impact)	Thundery bursts of rain possible from early in the day. Sporadic downpours and thunderstorms throughout the daytime, may clear northwards afternoon, but further thundery showers possible.	Risk of fairly persistent rain, some heavy showery bursts mixed in, soonest in western areas; possible thundery downpours particularly afternoon - moving west to east.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied, low cloud for a time, clearing	Fairly extensive
	Areas of low cloud covering some slopes in the morning. In rain, covering hills widely, patches to lower elevations. Then lifting mostly above hills afternoon.	Covering the hills most persistently toward the west, lowering widely in rain, banks of cloud from mid to some lower slopes upwards. Often extensive above 500-600m toward west. Some breaks in east.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% rising to 80% afternoon	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun often obscured by thick high cloud, widely overcast in rain. Hazy or murky for a time, may improve to give sun and very good visibility afternoon.	Largely cloudy, glimpses of sun in east mainly morning, where visibility possibly good for a time. Misty or murky in rain.
Temperature (at 600m)	14 to 16C, warm from dawn, but tending to drop slightly toward dusk.	10 to 13C. Feeling like 3 to 5C directly in the wind.
And in the valleys	15C at dawn, rising to 24C away from rain into afternoon; humid, but becoming fresher later.	12C at dawn, rising to 19C afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 14 July, 2025

Lowering pressure from southwest late Sunday into Monday bringing increasing risk bursts of rain and thunderstorms to start the new week, strong and gusty southerly winds. Temperatures will cool towards average. Heavy rain likely moving across England and Wales on Tuesday accompanied by near-gale southwesterlies, lighter winds Scotland. Low pressure is likely to be common in the extended outlook with slow-moving areas of showery rain, some thundery bursts locally, interspersed with drier days. Temperatures often on the warm side, some humid days.
