




The southernmost Pennines, covering the entire Peak District National Park, also extending north to hills accessed from Hebden Bridge, and including the hills immediately north of Manchester.

General Summary for Sunday, 3 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 3 August, 2025

Rain, low cloud and fog ahead of a front will clear Scotland late morning and England and Wales afternoon - but high humidity may maintain a little drizzle and low cloud Wales (most likely SW). Cloud base may not rise sufficiently to clear higher mountains mainly in W Scotland.

Headline for Peak District

Wet, windy and misty; clearing into afternoon.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 3 August, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly, 30mph morning Easing afternoon to 20-25mph.		
Effect of wind on you?	Will widely impede ease of walking and notable wind chill; becoming small afternoon.		
How wet?	Rain and drizzle; clearing into afternoon		
(Precipitation and its impact)	Morning to early afternoon: Rain and drizzle frequently. Mid afternoon onwards: Dry.		
Cloud on the hills?	Higher areas extensively foggy until well into afternoon		
	Extensive down to lower slopes until mid afternoon, particularly more western hills. From mid afternoon, over an hour or two, hills clearing.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	10%, rising to be almost certain late afternoon		
Sunshine?	Periods of sunshine from mid or late afternoon. Good visibility after rain clears although slight haze.		
Air clarity (below cloud)			
Temperature (at 600m)	13 to 15C warmest eastern summits.		
And in the valleys	Will reach 20 to 22C mid to late afternoon, warmest more eastern areas.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	South turning westerly; soon 50mph; risk temporarily 60mph higher tops. Easing from early afternoon: 30mph by dusk. Expect difficult conditions - you could be blown over with progress very slow. Significant wind chill.	Northwesterly; slowly easing through day from 35mph post dawn to 25mph early evening. Widely strenuous walking and considerable wind chill morning; conditions will progressively ease.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain, clearing into afternoon Rain for several hours mid morning until into the afternoon. From mid or late afternoon, only the odd shower.	Showers A few showers - although possibly the rain frequent over an hour or two morning.
Cloud on the hills?	Fog, largely clearing afternoon Soon shrouding higher hills and middle of day and into afternoon, patches near or below 300m. Around mid afternoon, the hills clearing.	Mostly or all clearing After dawn, cloud may shroud higher areas widely, but by mid to late morning, cloud base mostly above 500m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%; rising to 90% mid afternoon	30% rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine extensive mid to late afternoon, particularly more eastern dales. Visibility poor during rain, improving, but staying very hazy.	Patchwork of sun, although perhaps little sun morning on more western areas. Good visibility although a haze.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	11C, Directly in the wind, will feel like -2C. Will reach 17 to perhaps in eastern dales locally 19C in the afternoon.	9C; rising a couple of degrees or so through day. Feeling near freezing point directly in the Will reach 17 to perhaps 19C in the afternoon.

A mixed week: unusually stormy for August on Monday northern Britain, then intermittent rain though the week, most frequent and heaviest western mountains together with areas of low cloud and pulses of strong wind.
