

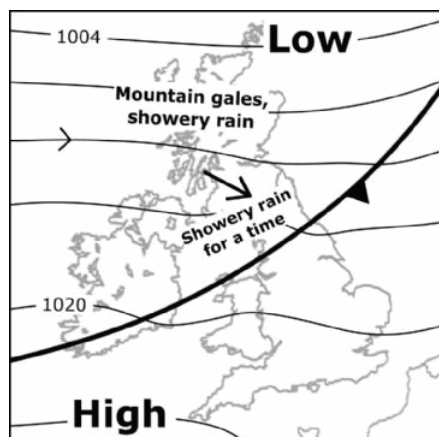
# Peak District

## General Summary for Saturday, 9 August, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 9 August, 2025

Windy, gales over Scottish mountains and highest tops in northern England throughout the day. A cold front brings a band of showery rain, weakening as it moves southwards. Showery much of the day in western Scotland, scattered heavy showers advancing east over the Highlands. Feeling chilly on tops.

### Headline for Peak District

Windy, largely dry.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 9 August, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 25 to 35mph, at times 40mph highest tops and edges.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Strenuous walking on exposed higher terrain, buffeting gusts near some edges. Feeling cool.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Little or no rain</b> Patchy light rain moving onto western hills near/north of Manchester for a time into afternoon. Little if any rain further south and eastwards.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mostly little</b> Any early mist patches soon dispersing. Local cloud banks may cap high western slopes around rain.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun and cloud, thickening to cover sky for a time into afternoon. Visibility good, some distant haze.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	11 to 14C. Feeling like 3 to 5C in the wind.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	12C at dawn, rising to 20C afternoon.

## Peak District - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West turning southwest later southerly, 20mph at first, easing to 10mph or less.	Southwest turning southerly 10-15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small</b>	<b>Small</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain not expected</b>	<b>Rain unlikely</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little or none</b>  Any early patches of cloud briefly on western slopes soon lifting above the hills.	<b>Little if any</b>  Possible brief patchy cloud on some slopes mainly Lancashire Pennines early morning, soon clearing. Otherwise clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Soon above 90%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny. Visibility increasingly very good.	Sun and high cloud, visibility good, but some haze.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	11C rising to 16C afternoon; little change evening into night.	15C in morning, rising to 19C afternoon; feeling humid.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	12C at dawn, rising to 22C afternoon.	14C at dawn, rising to 25C afternoon.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 10 August, 2025

A ridge of high pressure expands briefly northwards on Sunday - most places dry all day, variable cloud and some warm sun. A front moves in from the southwest later and will affect Scotland into Monday with rain, drizzle and low cloud, also damp and misty at least on Monday morning for the Lakes. Very warm and humid over England and Wales in the first half of the week, but this comes with a risk of thundery bursts of rain drifting northeastwards. Less warm for Scotland, though humid for a time. Later in the week, southwesterlies prevail in Scotland, low cloud often covering western hills, but small amounts of rain. Higher pressure further south, mostly dry and warm England, Wales & S/E Scotland.
