

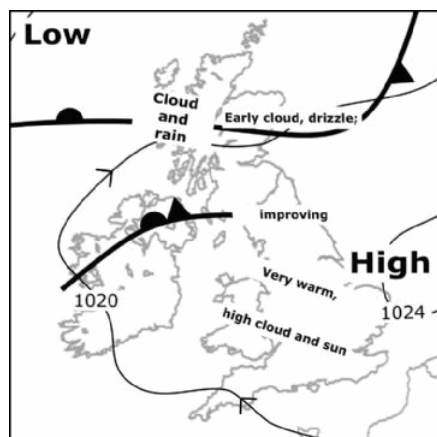
Peak District

General Summary for Monday, 11 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 August, 2025

Morning cloud and patchy rain/drizzle around north England and Scotland, primarily in the west, with a blustery west-southwesterly. Conditions easing for most though west Scotland tends to remain foggy with rain towards northwest. South Pennines and Wales substantially dry with little cloud on hills; very warm here.

Headline for Peak District

Very warm; often sunny through high cloud

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 11 August, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest turning southerly 10-15mph. Local 20-25mph higher areas toward north early morning.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any Possible brief patchy cloud on some slopes, mainly Lancashire Pennines early morning, soon clearing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun and high cloud. Visibility good, but some haze building from the south later.
Temperature (at 600m)	15C in morning, rising to 20C or locally warmer afternoon; feeling humid. Little change into nighttime.
And in the valleys	14C at dawn, rising to 25C afternoon.

All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 12 August, 2025

Very warm and humid over England and Wales in the first half of the week, this bringing a risk of thundery bursts of rain drifting northeastwards - these likely very local. Warm and humid air briefly extends across Scotland on Tuesday as well. Confidence in detail is low from Wednesday onward: risk of showers increasingly present from Wednesday evening through Thursday for many areas, which may produce heavy or thundery bursts and tending to stay warm. High pressure will rebuild from the north into the weekend, reducing the risk of rain and increasing the chance for sunny spells.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2025.
