

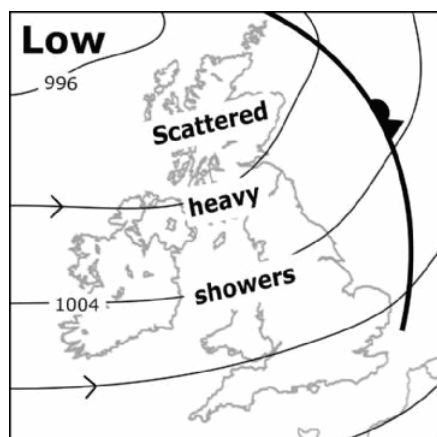
Peak District

General Summary for Saturday, 13 September, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 September, 2025

Showery south-westerly airflow across the mountains. Most frequent showers western hills, where they will band into prolonged rain for a time with heavy or even torrential bursts. Scattered heavy showers spreading to eastern mountains too. Risk of thunder. Cloud shrouding western hills, occasional further east.

Headline for Peak District

Blustery and cool. Cloud mostly above tops, despite heavy showers; risk thunder.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 13 September, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 20 to 25mph, at times 30mph higher exposed tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery over higher exposed terrain, in places may affect ease of walking. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Scattered showers, some heavy Dry at times, especially early in the morning, but clusters of showery rain spreading from the southwest. Local heavy bursts, risk of hail and thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Most cloud above tops Occasional patches of cloud drifting onto higher moors, mostly western areas in the morning and in rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun mostly morning in east. Visibility often very good, reduced briefly in showers.
Temperature (at 600m)	7 to 9C. Feeling near-freezing on tops directly in the wind.
And in the valleys	8C or locally cooler at dawn in east; rising to 14C afternoon.

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 14 September, 2025

During Sunday and into Monday, a deeper Atlantic low is expected to move in, bringing more extensive heavy rain northwards and gales - the strongest wind probably focused on England & Wales. Some improvement expected for a time into middle of next week, but the longer range outlook into late September remains unsettled.
