

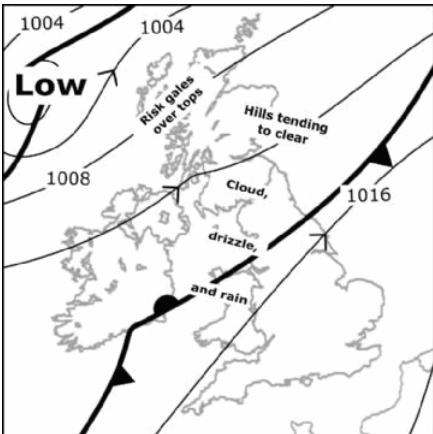
Peak District

General Summary for Friday, 19 September, 2025



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 19 September, 2025

Mostly dry and blustery for Scottish Highlands; cloud, some showers, and risk of gales on west coast tops. Persistent cloud and rain for southern Scotland, north England, and north Wales with a similar risk of gales on highest tops. Rain more patchy south Pennines and south Wales, some cloud breaks to inland summits.

Headline for Peak District

Patchy rain and drizzle, mostly north; some cloud breaks

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 19 September, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 25 to 30mph, some stronger breezes in the morning.
Effect of wind on you?	Ease of walking affected in places where exposed on tops and near edges, particularly early. Feeling cool.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of patchy rain and drizzle, mostly north Drizzly at times over high moors, particularly those near and north of M62. A few odd patches of rain will drift around as well. Southern moors may remain substantially dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Widespread higher areas most of the day From dawn, widely foggy from middle slopes upward. Cloud bases tending to rise slightly through afternoon, most terrain above 500-600m remaining in cloud until late in the day when southeast tops may see breaks.
Chance of cloud free summits?	10%, rising to 40% southern moors
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Only some patchy sunshine through high cloud in the south, otherwise overcast. Poor visibility northwest, better further east and south, good below cloud.
Temperature (at 600m)	14C rising to 16C. Feeling near 7C where directly exposed to wind.
And in the valleys	15C from dawn, rising towards 19 or 20C, likely warmest southeast. Quite humid.

Some showers into northern Scotland on Monday will fade for a substantially dry week ahead with good sunny breaks for many. Temperatures staying cool but slowing rising day-by-day.
