



## General Summary for Monday, 10 November, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 10 November, 2025

Heavy rain for much of the Highlands from dawn into the morning, moving northwards, clearing to leave patchy rain, local showers in west; cloud base rising. Some showery rain in the Lakes, drier Pennines. Showers in Wales merging into clusters of heavy rain. Moderate to locally gusty southerly winds.

#### **Headline for Peak District**

Largely dry until bursts of rain return from south, gusty later.

## **Detailed Forecast for Monday, 10 November, 2025**

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 15 to 25mph, risk suddenly gusty if rain develops later.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but more noticeable in places on exposed high terrain; feeling cool despite mild air.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Dry for several hours, heavy bursts later  Bursts of rain around dawn soon clearing northeastwards to be then dry for several hours through middle of day.  During afternoon, rain returning from south, heavy bursts frequent up to dusk, especially southern areas.	
Cloud on the hills?  Chance of cloud free summits?	Lifting above many hills for a time  Fog fairly extensive on high terrain at and before dawn, tending to lift toward or above many tops during morning. Around rain later, cloud base lowering.  50%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A mix of cloud and sun morning, cloudier afternoon.  Excellent visibility, reducing in rain.	
Temperature (at 600m)  And in the valleys	7C. Feeling close to freezing if exposed to wind. 9C at dawn, rising to 11 or 12C.

#### **Peak District - Looking Ahead**

	Tuesday 11 November	Wednesday 12 November
How windy? (On the summits)  Effect of wind on you?	Southerly, strengthening rapidly from before dawn to 35 to 45mph in morning, reaching 50mph at times high tops.  Soon arduous walking conditions, difficult in places on higher exposed terrain, very gusty near edges.	Southwesterly 20mph, to at times 30mph, likely strongest early and late in the day, turning southerly afternoon.  Blustery over hills around dawn, improving to be smaller middle of day, risk deteriorating to dusk onward.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain at times persistent	Briefly drier, risk heavy rain later
	Periods of steady rain, most likely in the morning, then staying drizzly, especially in western areas, some further pulses of rain at times. Heavier again evening into night.	Wet underfoot following overnight rain, which leaves patchy rain or drizzle into the morning, then becomes more persistent again from the south with time, risk heavier rain setting in again afternoon-evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive higher areas	Fairly extensive over hills
	Shrouding hills widely above 500-600m, at times lower in rain especially more west and southwestern areas.	Banks of cloud from lower elevations upward in the morning, may linger across many moors all day, local breaks for a time, but filling in again widely in rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and dull, murky in rain.	Largely cloudy, any sun weak and brief. Misty areas may linger, occasionally good visibility locally.
Temperature (at 600m)	6C rising in morning to 8C, reaching 10C from dawn; only small fall with height. Feeling below freezing directly in wind.	9 or 10C.
And in the valleys	8C at dawn, rising to 12C afternoon, staying mild with little change into evening and night.	Little change around 11 or 12C night and day.

## **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 11 November, 2025

Unsettled south-southwesterlies through midweek, periods of heavy rain widespread, further flooding for Wales, the Lakes and southwest Scotland. Mountain gales on Tuesday for England, Wales, S & E Scotland. Cooler than recently in Scotland, but still generally mild England and Wales by day and night.

Later in the week, colder air pushes into Scotland, dropping below freezing over the mountains, with some snow over higher terrain in the Highlands on Thursday-Friday; strong to gale force easterly winds develop widely. Colder northeasterly air is expected to become more widespread into the weekend and next week.

#### Forecast issued at 16:00 on Sunday, 9 November, 2025
