

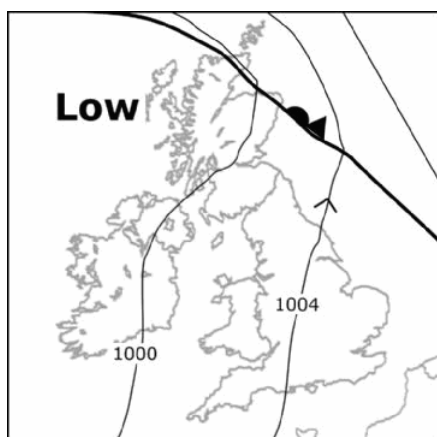
Peak District

General Summary for Sunday, 8 February, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 8 February, 2026

Little change with rain or on higher areas in Scotland snow on and off - showery in character Wales; and the mountains extensively foggy. Fairly light wind - except in northern Scotland at first.

Headline for Peak District

Rain, mainly afternoon; extensive fog. Light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 8 February, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain now and again Rain on and off mainly afternoon - most or all morning dry
Cloud on the hills?	All or nearly all fells persistently covered. Persistent fog above 300, later 400 or 500m most of region, but by afternoon perhaps breaks to 600m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely dull, misty or murky.
Temperature (at 600m)	4C
And in the valleys	Reaching 8C in the afternoon.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 9 February	Tuesday 10 February
How windy? (On the summits)	South-easterly 15 to 25mph.	Southeasterly mostly 20mph but may be stronger for a few hour from dawn
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small	Mostly fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Patches or spots of rain here and there Patches of rain, or just occasional spots, here and there. Amounts small, but nonetheless giving damp weather at times.	Rain occasionally It may stay dry much of or all day following overnight rain - that may linger until after dawn.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive Extensive low cloud covering hills above 350 to 500m.	May not clear highest tops Initially fog may be widespread from 300m up, but should improve as cloud base rises to 500m - possibly sometimes above 600m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	10%	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast. Widely misty and murky.	Occasional sunshine coming through. Mostly very good or perhaps excellent visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	4C	3C
And in the valleys	Lifting to 6 or 7C	Will reach around 8C in the afternoon

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 9 February, 2026

Little change over the next few days with continued foggy conditions over most mountains, and rain, or on higher mainly Scottish areas snow. Intermittently southeasterly winds approaching gale force.
Later in the week, progressively colder from the north with fresh snow on many mountains.
