

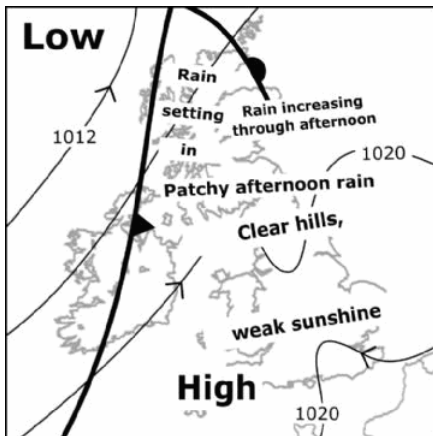
Peak District

General Summary for Saturday, 30 May, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 30 May, 2026

Early patchy rain west Scotland, east hills dry and clear of cloud. Afternoon brings more substantial rain and cloud to west Scotland, spreading east with time; becoming blustery west too. Weak sun and clear hills England and Wales, mild-to-warm, notable breezes later for Eryri NP and Lakeland.

Headline for Peak District

Cloud-free hills and warm sunshine, though thin high cloud

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 30 May, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly shifting southwesterly, 10-15mph, and often less for several hours. May trend towards the higher end of the range late in the day, occasionally shifting westerly too.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain during daylight The hills dry during the day. Overnight, a rising risk of patchy rain.
Cloud on the hills?	No cloud
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine but weakened by thin high cloud, this at times thickening and at times more shrouded as the day goes. Very good visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	10C rising to 16C.
And in the valleys	10C at dawn, rising to 21C afternoon.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 31 May	Monday 1 June
How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 20-25mph; some stronger gusts in the early morning over tops.	Southwesterly 20-25mph, speeds occasionally to 30mph, particularly in morning gusts.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, some nuisance breezes over high edges, and gusty early.	Ease of walking impacted on high summits, occasionally more impeded with a chilly feel.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers Scattered showers drifting from the west, small risk of a few heavier falls. An easing trend later afternoon.	Patchy rain, increasingly frequent Patchy light rain drifts from the southwest from before dawn, gradually becoming more frequent, a few heavy bursts, and a risk of becoming persistent as evening approaches.
Cloud on the hills?	Soon lifting above the summits A sheet of cloud above 500-600m at dawn, some lower banks in the west north of Kinder Scout. Lifting after daybreak to clear the summits by midday.	Often covering high terrain Patches at varied heights in the morning, briefly lifting to summits with breaks for several hours, but cloud then more often shrouding summits through afternoon, banks to 500m with lower patches around rain, fewer breaks with time.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising to 90%	70% lowering to 30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun. Very good visibility.	Some sunny glimpses in the morning but trending overcast. Very good visibility, deteriorating with fog and rain.
Temperature (at 600m)	9 or 10C, rising to 13C.	10C rising to 12C. Feeling like 3C in direct wind.
And in the valleys	11C at dawn rising to 17C.	11C at dawn, rising to 16C.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 31 May, 2026**

Changeable southwesterlies prevail as the weekend transitions into next week. Sunday sees showers for west hill groups, more widely and sometimes heavy in Scotland. Monday brings more widespread rain and wind into England and Wales, showers continue in Scotland.

An unsettled theme is expected during the first ten days of June. Frontal systems from the Atlantic bring periods of rain, wind, and low cloud. Wind speeds will vary, but reaching gale force on mountains for periods, England and Wales looking particularly vulnerable. A few brighter windows, but these brief and often interrupted by afternoon showers with a risk of local thunder. Sometimes chilly in Scotland when the wind turns northwesterly though staying above freezing to summits.
