

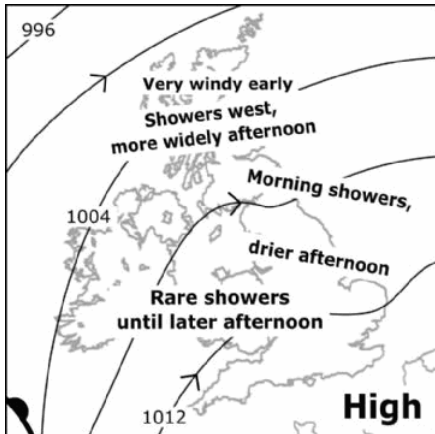
Peak District

General Summary for Friday, 5 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 5 June, 2026

Blustery start, gale-force gusts in N England and Scotland; easing. Chilly with showers in W Scotland, showers more widely over the highlands afternoon with sunny interludes. Early showers in England and Wales ease by afternoon, only well-scattered showers remain over Wales and S Pennines, plenty sun breaks.

Blustery, soon easing; early showers become well-scattered

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 5 June, 2026

<p>How windy? (On the summits)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>Westerly 30-35mph early, may gust 40mph just at and before dawn. Soon easing and shifting southerly, largely 15mph by early afternoon and several hours where may reach as low as 10mph later afternoon. Shifting southerly into evening.</p> <p>Strenuous walking early, strongest wind challenging stability with significant wind chill. Soon easing, mostly small effects likely by early afternoon.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Well-scattered showers, often dry</p> <p>Scattered showers drifting over the moors from the west from time to time, more often dry than wet, best dry periods early afternoon.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free summits?</p>	<p>Clearing the summits</p> <p>Cloud shrouds high terrain at dawn, bases as low as 400m on west slopes north of M62, risk of a few ragged lower patches just at dawn. Lifting, clearing the summits by midday or earlier.</p> <p>Rising to above 90%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Patchwork of sunshine, perhaps sunnier for a few midday hours, some thin high cloud building later in the day.</p> <p>Very good visibility.</p>
<p>Temperature (at 600m)</p> <p>And in the valleys</p>	<p>6C rising to 10C, only slight drop into night. Feeling like -3 to -5C in strongest early wind.</p> <p>8C at dawn, locally a degree cooler eastern valleys. Rising to 15C.</p>

(On the summits)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>S-SE'ly, later SW'ly, uncertainty of strongest winds - likely in range 35-45mph, risk higher, but also lighter for</p> <p>Beware of changing conditions - risk of difficult walking at least part of the day, but easing to lesser effects.</p>	<p>Southwesterly 25-30mph, periods of stronger speeds, risk gusts approaching 40mph.</p> <p>Ease of walking always impacted, some more strenuous moments over high edges where feeling chilly.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Risk of rain developing</p> <p>Patchy rain likely moving in from the southwest from dawn, small amounts initially. Risk of rain becoming more persistent and heavier for a time, but timing of this uncertain.</p>	<p>Little or no rain</p> <p>A few spots of light rain may drift onto the hills from the southwest from time to time, but the hills may well be dry all day.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free summits?</p>	<p>Extensive in rain, some variability</p> <p>Varied cloud banks filling in over higher moors as rain develops, may shroud many hills above 400-500m for several hours, but also with more broken periods with higher bases; timing is uncertain.</p> <p>40%</p>	<p>Likely clearing all hills</p> <p>May be fairly extensive from 500m upward in the early hours, but soon lifting and breaking, perhaps entirely above the summits by midday and through afternoon.</p> <p>Rising to 80%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Likely overcast, increasingly dull. Visibility good where dry if below cloud, but reducing in rain, becoming poor.</p>	<p>Sunshine in the morning is soon weakened by high cloud, increasingly so through the day. Very good visibility.</p>
<p>Temperature (at 600m)</p> <p>And in the valleys</p>	<p>7C rising to 10 or 11C afternoon, notably lowering overnight. Feeling near/below freezing in the wind.</p> <p>10C at dawn, rising to or 14 or 15C afternoon.</p>	<p>9C rising to 12 or 13C. Feeling just above freezing in strongest wind.</p> <p>8C at dawn, rising to 17C.</p>

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 6 June, 2026

Unsettled over the weekend as southwesterly flow draws several areas of rain across the country, best of dry slopes to the northeast, and perhaps a drier Sunday for England and Wales through blustery, some uncertainty in detail. Generally unsettled next week too: showers affect most hills Monday and Tuesday, lowest cloud and most persistent rain along western slopes, but with some breaks as well with sunshine. Timing of most unsettled weather remains uncertain, but some risk of a deeper area of lower pressure from Wednesday or later brining widespread strong winds, probably gales over many summits, with prolonged heavy rain. Temperatures probably trending milder again into the weekend, pressure may begin to rise in the south, but this uncertain as well.
