

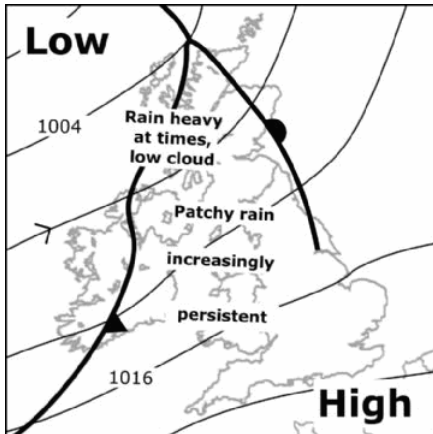
Peak District

General Summary for Sunday, 7 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 7 June, 2026

Scotland: Strong and gusty south-westerly winds will drive hill fog and frequent rainfall across western mountains, setting in during afternoon. Rainfall patchier across eastern hills with higher bases.
 England and Wales: Windy with patchy light rain onto western hills, becoming more widely damp or wet through the day.

Headline for Peak District

Blustery, with low cloud lifting off the hills. A little patchy rain, mainly later in day.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 7 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 25-30mph, periods of stronger speeds, particularly later where may be sustained at or above 35mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Ease of walking always impacted, increasingly strenuous over high edges with time and wind chill increasing.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little rain until later A few spots of light rain may drift onto the hills from the southwest from time to time, but the hills may be dry well into the day. A rising risk as afternoon goes of increasing patchy rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Likely clearing all hills May be fairly extensive from 500m upward in the early hours, but soon lifting and breaking, perhaps entirely above the summits by midday and through afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine in the morning will be weakened by high cloud, turning overcast later. Very good visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	9C rising to 12 or 13C. Feeling just above freezing in strongest wind.
And in the valleys	8C at dawn, rising to 17C.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 8 June	Tuesday 9 June
How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 15 to 25mph.	South-westerly 15 to 25mph, may reach 30mph at times tops in the afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small effect on walking, but feeling blustery and rather cool on exposed high terrain.	May impede walking at times over the tops in the afternoon, with a marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain then odd showers A band of rain clears eastward early morning, then drier but a scattering of showers.	Showers becoming widespread Showers at first, concentrated in the west, but becoming widespread across the area. Some hail possible, with the risk of thunder too.
Cloud on the hills?	Clearing hills Early banks of cloud over higher moors, lifting and clearing by late morning.	Mostly above tops, some patches. Despite the frequently cloudy skies, bases generally above the tops. However, patches may occasional form here and there in and around rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun by middle of day. Visibility very good after early rain clears.	Patchy sun, but skies tending to fill in with cloud for lengthy periods. Visibility often very good away from showers.
Temperature (at 600m)	7 to 9C. Feeling near freezing directly in the wind.	5C lifting to 7C
And in the valleys	10C at dawn, rising to 15C afternoon, but always a little cooler in rain.	Temperatures lifting to highs of 13C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 8 June, 2026**

The unsettled period of weather will persist over the coming week with low pressure area centres tracking just to the northwest of Scotland, allowing south-westerly winds to prevail. Rainfall often showery in nature, but coming in frequently to western mountains with the greatest falls for western Scotland. Chilly and windy at times; freezing level touching highest tops Scotland on Tuesday and Wednesday, when showers will fall as snow over the tops. Temperatures trending milder again next weekend, pressure may begin to rise in the south to give drier weather more widely.
