

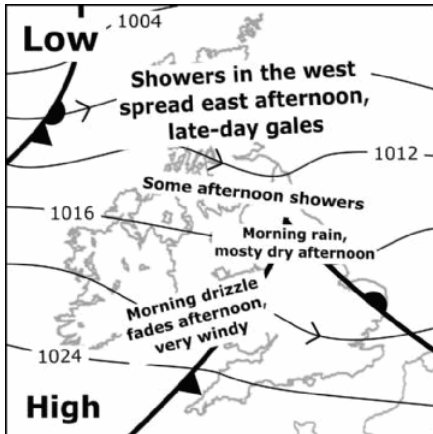
Peak District

General Summary for Friday, 12 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 June, 2026

Strong wind for all. Showers and fog in west Scotland all day, passing east afternoon, persistent for a few later hours. Gales into Scotland from the west late afternoon into evening. Morning rain, drizzle, and fog in England, easing afternoon, driest S Pennines. Drizzle in Wales fades afternoon, sun glimpses break out.

Headline for Peak District

Morning rain, largely dry afternoon; strong wind

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 12 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 35-40mph most of the day, may be slightly lighter for a few early hours.
Effect of wind on you?	Strenuous walking in exposure all day, at times more arduous; maintaining balance requiring notable effort. Feeling cool despite fairly mild air.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain much of morning Generally damp over the moors from dawn with drizzle and patchy rain setting in through much of morning. Rain breaks through afternoon, substantially dry by evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive on high terrain, lifting with breaks afternoon Often foggy over higher moors above 500-600m, sometimes shrouding hill slopes to lower elevations in west. Through afternoon, bases rise as does the chance of breaks, some moments of clear summits increasingly probable.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% rising to 50%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, glimpses of sun mostly eastern areas, and perhaps more widely late in the day. Poor visibility over the tops through most of morning, improving as rain and cloud break.
Temperature (at 600m)	11C rising to 13 or 14C, notably cooling into evening/nighttime to 10C or cooler. Feeling like 0 to 3C where exposed to wind.
And in the valleys	12C at dawn, rising to 18C afternoon.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 13 June	Sunday 14 June
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	West shifting northwesterly 25-35mph, occasional stronger swathes over high tops to 40mph or stronger. Walking impeded in exposure and at times strenuous with a chilly feel.	Northwesterly 20-25mph early, to 30mph just at dawn. Soon easing, to 15mph and often less from midday onward. Fairly small, though a blustery and gusty start on the high tops.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little expected A few well-scattered patches of light rain drift onto the moors from the northwest; the falls light and brief and more often dry.	Any rain unlikely Remote chance of rare odd spots of light rain in the morning, but the moors likely entirely dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Lifting off the summits Patchy cloud on high terrain early in the day, possibly some ragged lower patches too, mostly western slopes. Cloud lifts for clear hills afternoon.	Early cloud clears the hills May be fairly extensive over the high edges at dawn with variable banks to lower slopes in the west. Soon after sunrise, cloud lifts above the summits.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising to 90%	Rising to above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bursts of sunshine, some high cloud weakening the sun. Very good visibility, perhaps a light haze.	Mostly sunny, becoming weakened by high cloud. Very good visibility.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	7C rising to 11C. Feeling just above freezing in strongest wind. 9C at dawn, rising to 16C, or possibly warmer southernmost valleys.	6C rising to 11C. 8C at dawn rising to 16C.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 13 June, 2026**

Higher pressure to the southwest this weekend, bringing warmer and drier conditions to Wales. Showery rain affecting Scotland on Saturday, some patches reaching northwest England; staying very windy and cool in Scotland and northern England on Saturday too. Sunday will be a clearing day for most: early rain in Scottish Highlands easing and most cloud lifting off summits, sunshine but weakened by high cloud. Temperature more widely mild, warm in Wales.

Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but cooler westerly air likely returns at times mid-late week.

Pressure generally trending higher, but extensively settled weather may remain elusive in the near-term.
