

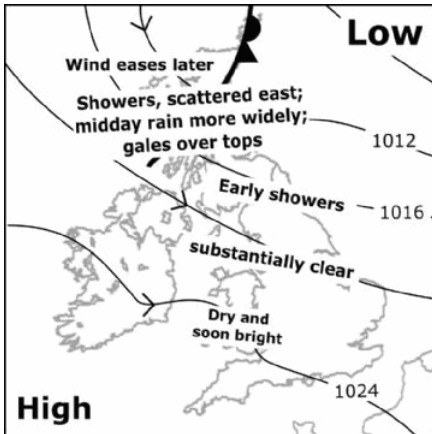
# Peak District

## General Summary for Saturday, 13 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 13 June, 2026

Chilly and showery west Scottish highlands, fewer showers east but several afternoon hours of more widespread rain, later easing. Some early showers from south Scotland to north Wales, largely fading with sun breaks; south Wales is dry and brighter. Strong wind widely, easing Wales and north Scotland.

### Headline for Peak District

Very windy; some early light sprinkles soon fade

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 13 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West shifting northwesterly 30-35mph, to 40mph over the tops in the early hours. Trending towards the lighter end of the range, at times below 30mph, but with stronger winds returning too.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking impeded in exposure much of the day and feeling chilly, moments of more strenuous walking in exposure, most notably early.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Little expected</b> A few well-scattered patches of light rain drift onto the moors from the northwest, the falls light and brief and hills more often dry. Near and south of Kinder Scout probably entirely dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Lifting off the summits</b> Patchy cloud on high terrain early in the day, possibly some ragged lower patches too, mostly western slopes. Cloud lifts through morning, the hills probably free of cloud afternoon.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Some sunny glimpses, but most often cloudy until late in the day. Very good visibility, some haze in the distance to the west.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	7C rising to 11C; Lancashire Pennines stay a degree cooler. Feeling around freezing in strongest direct wind.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	8 or 9C at dawn, rising to 15C, or possibly warmer southernmost valleys.

## Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 14 June	Monday 15 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northwesterly 20-25mph early, to 30mph just at dawn. Soon easing, to 15mph and often less from midday onward. <b>Fairly small, though a blustery and gusty start on the high tops.</b>	South-southwesterly 15-20mph; some chance of lower speeds, particularly early, but confidence is low. <b>Probably fairly small, but a risk of stronger breezes impeding walking on high terrain.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Any rain unlikely</b> Remote chance of odd spots of light rain in the morning, but the moors likely entirely dry.	<b>Patchy rain</b> The early hours probably stay dry, but a rising risk of patchy rain approaching from the southwest towards midday, continuing afternoon but dry windows are likely too.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Early cloud clears the hills</b>  May be fairly extensive over the high edges at dawn with variable banks to lower slopes in the west. Soon after sunrise, cloud lifts above the summits.	<b>Probably clear</b>  Some patchy cloud at various heights in the morning, many hills probably start clear of cloud, and mostly dissipating as morning gets going.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to above 90%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny, becoming weakened by high cloud. Very good visibility.	Mixed cloud and sun through morning, more often cloudy afternoon. Very good visibility.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>  <b>And in the valleys</b>	6C rising to 11C.  8C at dawn rising to 16C.	9C rising to 14C.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 14 June, 2026**

Sunday will be a clearing day for most under a core of high pressure: early rain in Scottish Highlands easing, most cloud lifting off all hills except the north of Scotland, and good sunshine through weakened by high cloud. Temperature more widely mild, warm in Wales. Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but may stay cooler in Scotland as low pressure to the northwest recycles air from the north Atlantic back onto the Munros. Tuesday into Wednesday shows indications of a wetter and windier spell. Pressure generally trending higher later in the week, but extensively settled weather remains elusive until at least the following week.
