

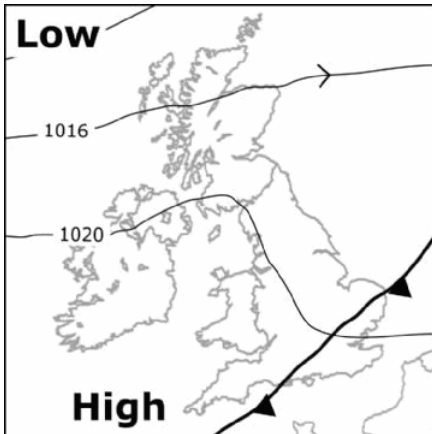
# Peak District

## General Summary for Saturday, 20 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:  
Based on forecast chart for noon 20 June, 2026**

Windy with a few drizzly showers and low cloud N and W Scotland. Elsewhere, fairly light wind (particularly Wales and S Pennines), and extensively dry. Widespread fog will clear most summits - although patches of fog lower slopes near some west coasts.

**Headline for Peak District**

Sunshine becoming extensive; little wind.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 20 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwest to westerly 5 to 10mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Negligible</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Early drizzly showers clearing</b> Chance only of light drizzly showers after dawn. Soon dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Higher areas starting foggy, soon clearing</b> Improving markedly as fog clears around mid morning.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Almost certain by late morning</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Extensive sunshine by late morning. Visibility excellent.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	12C to in afternoon 16C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Will reach 18 to 21C afternoon, warmest eastern dales.

## Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 21 June	Monday 22 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Easterly or variable, often 10mph or less, but may reach 20 or 25mph for a few hours. <b>Negligible much of day.</b>	South to southwesterly between 15 and on higher tops 25mph. <b>Fairly small</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Chance of a burst of rain later in day.	<b>Risk bursts of rain, possible thunder</b> Confidence low: it may remain dry. But risk of a few bursts of rain, perhaps brief although later in day risk thunderstorms.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little if any</b>  There may well be none, but risk fog now and again higher slopes afternoon (most likely during/after a shower).	<b>Very little for most of the day - may form in rain.</b>  Generally the hills free of cloud although fog may form higher slopes in rain.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine weakened or giving way at times by areas of high cloud. Visibility excellent or superb although may become hazy later in day.	Patches of sunshine although extensive high level cloud. Visibility good, although a haze.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>  <b>And in the valleys</b>	15C at dawn, rising to 20C.  13C at dawn, rising to 25C afternoon, increasingly humid.	19C - very warm.  23 to 27C in afternoon - feeling humid.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 21 June, 2026**

Extensively dry and very warm indeed England and Wales although around Monday chance of thunderstorms. Rain and low cloud at times Scotland, mainly affecting western mountains - although later next week the warmth further south may penetrate north into or perhaps to all Scotland.
