

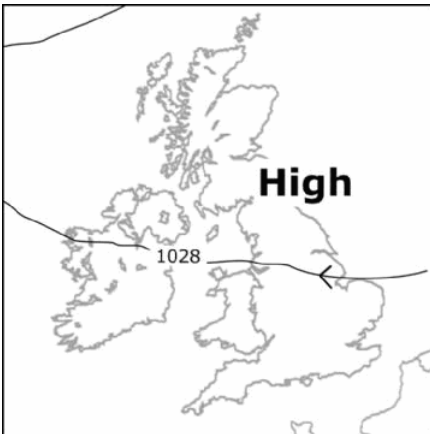
Peak District

General Summary for Sunday, 21 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 21 June, 2026**

Extensive bright sunshine - beware of sunburn and dehydration - and light wind. Cloud and a few brief showers NW Highlands will move away north, whilst along the Pennines and later Cumbria and S Scotland, patchy cloud and an isolated shower will form.

Headline for Peak District

Light wind; bright sunshine, mainly morning. Risk rain briefly.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 21 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly, 10mph or less, but from about midday strengthening to reach 20 or 25mph by late afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible much of day.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Risk isolated bursts of rain afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any There may well be none, but risk fog now and again higher slopes afternoon (most likely during/after a shower).
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bright sunshine morning, intermittently cloudy afternoon. Visibility excellent.
Temperature (at 600m)	15C at dawn, rising to 19C.
And in the valleys	13C at dawn, rising to 23 to 25C afternoon; increasingly humid.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 22 June	Tuesday 23 June
How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly between 15 and on higher tops perhaps 25mph.	Southwesterly 15 to perhaps 25mph,.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk bursts of rain, possible thunder Confidence low: it may remain dry. But risk of a few bursts of rain, perhaps brief although from afternoon chance scattered thunderstorms.	Rain unlikely Chance thundery showers at first.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little for most of the day - may form in rain. Generally the hills free of cloud although fog may form on higher slopes in rain.	Little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	Soon almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine although often through thin high level cloud. Visibility good, although a haze.	Sunshine extensive, sometimes weak due to thin high level cloud. Good visibility although hazy.
Temperature (at 600m)	19C - very warm.	19C rising to a very warm (and exceptionally humid) 24C.
And in the valleys	23 to 27C in afternoon - feeling humid.	Very warm indeed as afternoon temperatures approach 29 to 31C.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 22 June, 2026**

Extensively dry, very warm but very humid indeed England and Wales, although around Monday chance of a thunderstorm. Rain and low cloud at times Scotland, mainly affecting western mountains - although later next week the warmth encroaching into Scotland. There may well be widespread thunderstorms later in the week, before less hot weather extends from the Atlantic around next weekend.
