

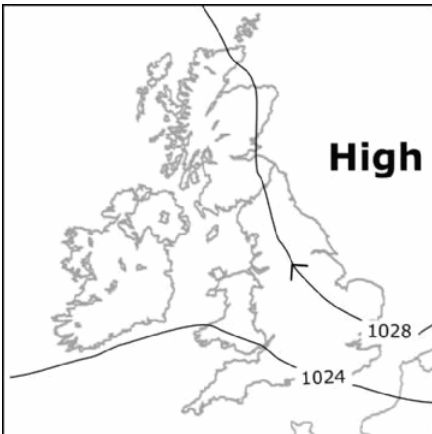
Peak District

General Summary for Monday, 22 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 22 June, 2026**

Although high pressure will dominate - bringing high temperatures and sunshine to Wales and most of England, in the far north and across Scotland, high level cloud may bring rain for an hour or two, this leading to formation of low cloud that may be very slow to lift.

Headline for Peak District

Light wind. Sunshine and very warm; but chance of shower.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 22 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly between 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of the odd shower but extensively dry Here and there a burst of rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little for most of the day - may form in rain. Patches particularly more eastern hills for a few hours from dawn; but will all clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Greater than 90% by late morning
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Increasingly sunny through morning although areas of thin high level cloud. Visibility good, although a haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	15 rising to 21C - very warm.
And in the valleys	23 to 27C in afternoon - feeling humid.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 23 June	Wednesday 24 June
How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 15 to possibly 20 or 5mph late in day.	Direction may well vary, 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance thundery showers at first.	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any	Little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon almost certain	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine extensive, perhaps sometimes weak due to thin high level cloud. Good visibility although hazy.	Extensive sunshine. Persistent haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	19C rising to a very warm (and exceptionally humid) 24C.	20C rising toward an exceptionally hot 24 to perhaps 27C.
And in the valleys	Very warm indeed as afternoon temperatures approach 29 to 31C.	Rising to 29 to perhaps 33C in the afternoon.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 23 June, 2026**

A few days of often sunny and very warm weather. Some doubt remains about daytime temperatures - these possibly exceptionally hot on Wednesday (England and Wales) and Thursday (everywhere). The range in mountain temperatures given on Wednesday's forecasts reflects the uncertainty. Gradually less hot Friday and into the weekend; the change accompanied by thunderstorms in some areas.
