

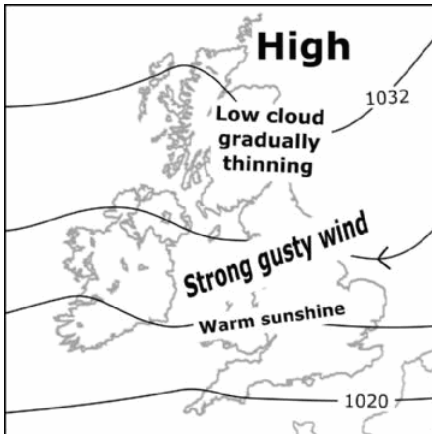
Peak District

General Summary for Sunday, 12 July, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 12 July, 2026**

Cloud shrouds many hills in Scotland and NE England in the morning, more broken westwards; slowly tending to thin to leave patchier cloud on higher tops mainly eastern Scotland by afternoon. A notably strong gusty easterly wind for England & Wales, but mostly sunny. Warm for Wales & Peak District.

Headline for Peak District

Strong breeze, gusty. Warm sunshine.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 12 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 20 to 25mph. Notable gusts over tops and stronger speeds early and late, in places 35mph around some tops and edges.
Effect of wind on you?	Ease of walking at times affected on high terrain, particularly early and late when strongest gusts affect stability.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Soon all clearing Patchy cloud covers the moors from overnight, briefly to middle or lower eastern slopes. Soon after sunrise, cloud begins to lift and break, likely none left on the moors by mid-morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50% at first rising to be practically certain.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy cloud breaking for extensive sunshine with very good visibility; some thin high cloud. High UV, beware sunburn.
Temperature (at 600m)	13C rising to 17 to 20C, warmest toward the west. Feeling like 4 to 8C directly in the wind.
And in the valleys	14C at dawn rising to 23 to 26C, western valleys noticeably warmer.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 13 July	Tuesday 14 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly 15-20mph; stronger sustained wind early with notable gusts over tops and downslope, risk approaching 35mph. Fairly small, but morning gusts may be quite strong, affecting stability.	Easterly 20 to 25mph, local gusts 30mph around some upper slopes and edges. Breezy over the hills, in places gustiness may start to affect comfortable walking, feeling cooler where exposed.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little or none Varied banks of cloud at all elevations may drift from the east in the early morning, likely well broken with little or no cloud west of high tops. Cloud soon lifts and dissipates after dawn for clear moors.	Some early low cloud, clearing Banks of low cloud over higher slopes early in the day, mostly eastern moors, soon lifting above the hills or largely dispersing by mid-morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	60% rising above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun increasingly extensive as early low cloud breaks. Very good visibility.	Sun mostly western areas early in the day, but breaking through more widely as early fog clears, visibility then very good.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	10C rising to 19C. 11C at dawn, rising to 23C, or 25C in western valleys south of Kinder Scout.	10 to 13C from dawn, coolest if in cloud, rising to 18C afternoon. 12C at dawn, rising to 23 to 25C afternoon, warmest in western valleys.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 13 July, 2026**

A fine week of summer weather - warm and dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. High pressure north of the country keeps the skies mostly clear, some low-level cloud rolling inland from the North Sea at times. A prevailing easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures to western hill groups, valley temperatures often 25C, or warmer for Wales and Peak District, at times 30C. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Notably dry ground conditions, beware very high fire risk. Later in the week, an increasing risk of thundery showers forming, with a cooling trend into the weekend 18-19th.
