

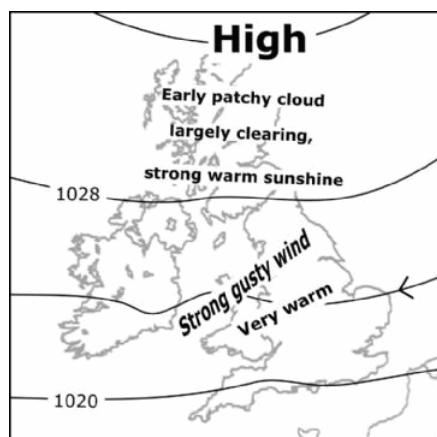
Peak District

General Summary for Monday, 13 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 July, 2026

Varied banks of cloud around hills in Scotland and Pennines early in the day, but increasingly dispersing during the morning to leave most or all hills clear. Strong sunshine, pleasant temperatures, warmest in western areas. Mostly light wind for the Highlands, gusty easterly further south. Very warm for Wales.

Headline for Peak District

Gusty wind; warm sunshine, hills clear.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 13 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 15-20mph; stronger sustained wind early with notable gusts over tops and downslope, local 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but morning gusts may be quite strong, affecting stability.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little or none Patchy banks of cloud from dawn over some moors mainly in the east, soon lifts and dissipates after dawn for clear hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun soon widespread. Very good visibility. High UV, beware sunburn, dehydration.
Temperature (at 600m)	10C rising to 19C.
And in the valleys	11C at dawn, rising to 24C, local 26C in southwestern valleys.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 14 July	Wednesday 15 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 20 to 25mph, local gusts 30mph around some upper slopes and edges.	Easterly 15 to 25mph, some gusty spots 30mph around tops and edges, locally downslope to west in morning.
Effect of wind on you?	Breezy over the hills, in places gustiness may start to affect comfortable walking, feeling cooler where exposed.	Feeling breezy over the hills, fairly small effect on walking, but some more notable gusty areas.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Some early low cloud, clearing Patchy cloud banks over higher slopes early in the day, mostly eastern moors, soon lifting above the hills or largely dispersing by mid-morning.	Early patchy cloud clears From dawn, some fog over higher moors mainly eastern areas above 500m, soon all thinning and dispersing in morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70% at first, becoming 100%	60% becoming practically certain.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun mostly western areas early in the day, but breaking through more widely as early fog clears, visibility then very good.	Strong sunshine most of the day, some thin high cloud. Visibility excellent, some early haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	11 to 13C from dawn, coolest if in cloud, rising to 20C afternoon.	13C at dawn, rising to 19 to 21C afternoon.
And in the valleys	13C at dawn, rising to 25 to 27C afternoon, warmest in western valleys.	13C at dawn, rising to 26 to 28C afternoon, warmest western valleys.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 14 July, 2026**

A fine week of summer weather - warm and dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. High pressure keeps the skies mostly clear, some low-level cloud rolling inland from the North Sea at times. A prevailing easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures for western hill groups, valley temperatures often 25C, or warmer for Wales and Peak District, at times 30C. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Notably dry ground conditions, beware very high fire risk. A cooling trend toward the weekend as north-northeasterly winds develop, a few showers possible, but a dry theme likely into early next week.
