

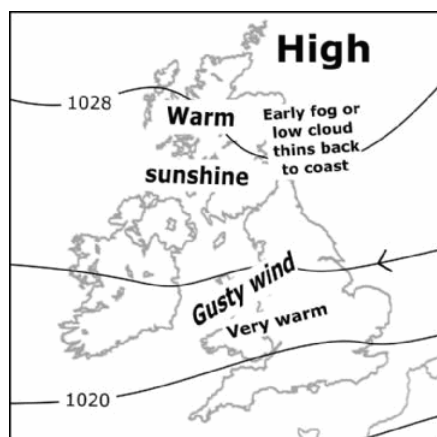
Peak District

General Summary for Tuesday, 14 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 14 July, 2026

Dry with strong sunshine, warmest in west.

Early fog and low cloud over eastern hills retreats toward the North Sea in the morning. Gusty easterlies mainly central Scotland southwards, strongest for Wales.

Extremely dry ground conditions - beware high risk of fire.

Headline for Peak District

Warm sunshine, early patchy cloud; breezy, gusty.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 14 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 20 to 25mph, local gusts 30mph around some upper slopes and edges, typically strongest gusts in the morning.
Effect of wind on you?	Breezy over the hills, in places gustiness may start to affect comfortable walking, feeling cooler where exposed.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Some early low cloud, clearing Patchy cloud banks over higher slopes early in the day, mostly eastern moors, soon lifting above the hills or largely dispersing by mid-morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70% at first, becoming 100%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun best in western areas at first, patchy east, but breaking through more widely as early fog clears, visibility then very good. High UV, beware sunburn.
Temperature (at 600m)	10 to 13C from dawn, coolest if in cloud, rising to 18 to 21C afternoon. Directly in the wind will feel fresher, but beware dehydration.
And in the valleys	13C at dawn, rising to 24 to 27C afternoon, warmest in southwestern valleys.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly 15 to 25mph, some gusty spots 30mph around tops and edges, locally downslope to west in morning. Feeling breezy over the hills, fairly small effect on walking, but some more notable gusty areas.	Easterly 15mph, at times gusts 20-25mph around high tops and some edges. Mostly small, but occasional noticeable gustier spots.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Early patchy cloud clears From dawn, some fog over higher moors mainly eastern areas above 500m, soon all thinning and dispersing in morning.	Soon clear Early patchy cloud banks may drift over the moors from dawn, soon thinning and dispersing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60% at first becoming 100%.	Soon practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine most of the day, a little thin fair-weather cloud. Visibility excellent, some early haze.	Sunshine over the hills dawn til dusk, occasional thin high cloud. Visibility very good, slight haze possible.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	13C at dawn, rising to 19 to 21C afternoon. 13C at dawn, rising to 25 to 27C afternoon, warmest western valleys.	14C from dawn, rising to 20C. 13C at dawn, rising to 25 to 27C afternoon, warmest southwestern valleys.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 15 July, 2026

Staying broadly fine likely through the weekend into early next week at least - dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. Some coastal fog rolling inland overnight for misty dawns in places this week.

Valley temperatures rising to 25C or above, typically warmer in Wales and Peak District. Gusty easterly winds for England and Wales. An ongoing very high risk of fire with extremely dry ground conditions. Into the weekend, northerly breezes develop more widely, a cooling trend for a time, particularly Scotland where summit temperatures likely dip back below 10C; some cloud may be drawn onto northern mountains at times, small chance of isolated showers.
