

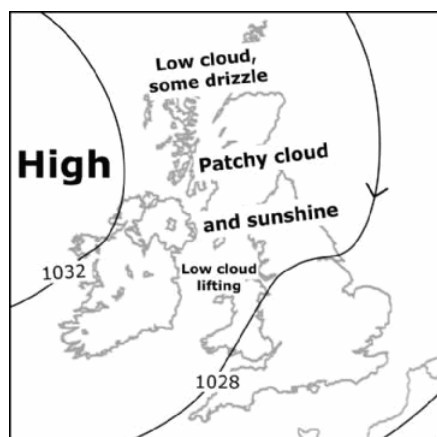
Peak District

General Summary for Monday, 20 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 20 July, 2026

Some patchy drizzle and low cloud covering many northern mountains in the Highlands in the morning. Cloud persists on hills toward northwest coasts, tending to lift and break further inland. Hills in England & Wales mostly clear. Wind fairly light overall. Very dry ground and high fire risk remains.

Headline for Peak District

Light wind. Dry and warm, sun and fair-weather cloud, hills clear.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 20 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Generally northerly, some variability in direction, 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected Small chance of an isolated brief light shower toward evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of cloud and sun, high cloud fills in somewhat afternoon. Very good visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	12C rising to 18C.
And in the valleys	10C at dawn, rising to 22 to 24C.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the summits)	North to northwesterly 5 to 15mph, increasing a little during day.	North to northwesterly 10 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Largely dry Small chance of an isolated shower late in the day into evening, mainly more northern parts of the region.	Rare if any light showers Chance of an odd drizzly shower western hills early in day, and possibly an isolated light shower toward evening in north.
Cloud on the hills?	Generally clear Rare if any brief patches on higher slopes, mainly morning.	Early patches soon clear Some cloud banks early morning may graze higher western slopes around 500-600m, but soon lifting above the hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	60% rising above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun. Visibility very good.	Patchwork of cloud and sun, possibly cloudier for a few hours. Visibility very good.
Temperature (at 600m)	13C rising to 17C afternoon.	12C rising to 17C.
And in the valleys	11C at dawn, rising to 23C afternoon.	11C at dawn, rising to 23C afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 21 July, 2026

Largely dry weather prevails as high pressure remains nearby to the west. A northwesterly flow keeps temperatures nearer to average for the time of year, dawn temperatures in the middle single digits in Scotland; staying warm in England and Wales but maximum summit temperatures only to the high teens. Cloud and drizzle affects northwest Scotland more often, occasionally drifting further south. Despite this, ground remains very dry with high fire risk, with ongoing wildfire management limiting access in places. A more unsettled trend develops during next weekend, bringing wind, rain and showers first to Scotland and increasingly widely. England and Wales remain quite warm.
