

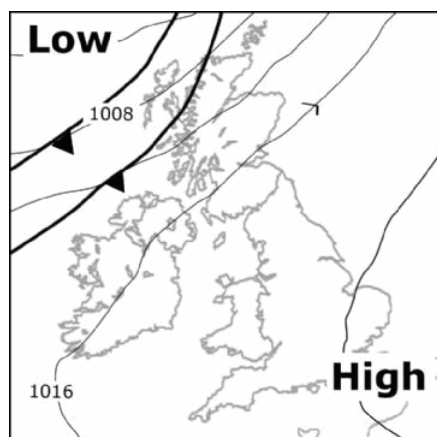
Peak District

General Summary for Saturday, 8 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 8 August, 2026

Ranging from persistent gales, and increasingly toward west and north, rain and fog across the Scottish Highlands to blustery but largely dry Cumbria and S Scotland.
 Extensively warm and sunny elsewhere.

Headline for Peak District

Fine warm and sunny - beware sunburn.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 8 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 20mph although lighter post dawn and again in evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive or unbroken bright sunshine. Excellent visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	12C rising to 20C.
And in the valleys	12C at dawn rising to 23 to 25C.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 9 August	Monday 10 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 30mph, probably easing a little afternoon onwards.	Northwesterly 15-20mph, dropping to very low speeds by afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking may begin strenuous, effects easing but wind remains a nuisance in exposure.	Becoming negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	A little rain, mainly N of Peak District Rain now and again, although in afternoon chance of drizzly rain fairly persistent north from Saddleworth.	Rain very unlikely
Cloud on the hills?	May form north from about Saddleworth Generally very little, although risk cloud base lowering to 300m western hills initially near Pendle, but the low cloud may later reach Saddleworth.	Little or none by mid or late morning
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine; very good visibility	Periods of sun - perhaps through areas of high level cloud. Excellent or increasingly superb visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	13 or 14C.	8C, rising to 15C.
And in the valleys	14C at dawn, rising to 19 or 20C, a little lower western hills north from about M62.	Will reach 19 to 21C by mid or late afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 9 August, 2026

Extensively fine and warm early next week - indeed very little rain or low cloud and frequently light winds England and Wales all week.

Generally less settled after midweek northwestwards across Scotland where occasional rain and areas of low cloud.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Friday, 7 August, 2026
