

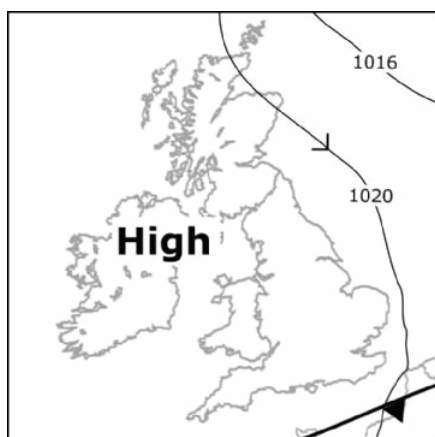
Peak District

General Summary for Monday, 10 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 August, 2026

Windy in northern and western Scotland, particularly morning.
 Elsewhere, the breeze dropping away. Periods of bright sunshine, particularly England and Wales - beware sunburn.
 Only occasional sunshine toward NW Scotland.

Headline for Peak District

Wind dropping. Bright sunshine.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 10 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 15-20mph, dropping to very low speeds by afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Becoming negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Cloud soon confined above the summits There may be patches higher western slopes over a few hours from dawn - will clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sun - perhaps through areas of high level cloud. Excellent or increasingly superb visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	9C, rising to 16C.
And in the valleys	Will reach 19 to 21C by mid or late afternoon.

How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	Rain very unlikely

Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	More or less unbroken sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility.	Extensive sunshine. Very good visibility although a haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	10C rising to 22C	15 rising to 23C.
And in the valleys	Rising to 27 to perhaps locally 30C by mid or late afternoon.	Reaching 27 to 30C in the afternoon.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 11 August, 2026**

Chance of bursts of rain, possibly locally thundery on Wednesday NW England northwards, with further occasional rain (and low cloud) later in the week, mainly across the W & NW Highlands.
The almost completely dry and warm weather will persist elsewhere. Underfoot conditions will remain exceptionally dry.
There may well be little change in the pattern into next week.
