

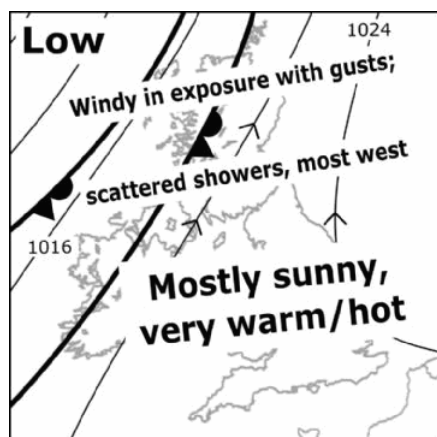
Peak District

General Summary for Wednesday, 12 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 August, 2026

Blustery on high terrain in Scotland, gusts pushing downslope in places. Scattered showery rain in the west, a few heavy bursts; some showers push east with time. Dry with hot sun and little wind for England and Wales, just some patchy high cloud in the north; beware risk of sunburn and dehydration.

Headline for Peak District

Hot and mostly sunny; risk sunburn and dehydration

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 12 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 10 to 15mph. Typically strongest in the morning and evening, with breezes approaching 20mph over high tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	No cloud expected
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine, some thin high cloud around at times. Very good visibility although a haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	15C rising to 26C, only small drop overnight.
And in the valleys	15C rising to 29 to 31C in the afternoon.

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 13 August, 2026

Mixed conditions early next week with patchy rain and sunny bursts here and there. With time, a trend towards stronger westerly winds with a few spells of more widespread rain: forecast confidence is low beyond the weekend.
