

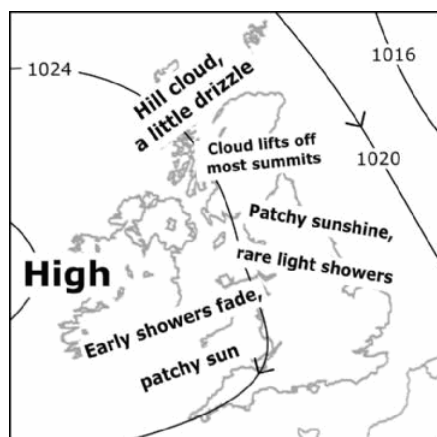
Peak District

General Summary for Saturday, 22 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 22 August, 2026

Cloud clings to northwest Scotland slopes, a little drizzle. Cloud clears most other Munros, varied banks over highest summits. Rare showers in England but most hills dry, morning cloud lifting off summits with patchy sunshine. Early showers in north and west Wales will clear for patchy sun as well.

Headline for Peak District

Any early cloud lifts off the hills, patchy sunshine

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 22 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly around 10mph, some variability above and below.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Likely dry A small chance of light showers, but most or all hills stay dry all day.
Cloud on the hills?	Little expected Some ragged patchy cloud here and there in the morning, mostly middle and upper slopes, this soon lifting and clearing off the tops for the rest of the day.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of cloud and sun, both cloudier and sunnier periods mixed in. Very good visibility, a little haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	8C rising to 13 or 14C.
And in the valleys	6 or 7C rising to 17C.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Northerly 10mph, trending variable and lighter. Negligible.	Southeasterly 15-20mph, trending towards higher speeds with time and further strengthening overnight. Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Lifting off the summits At dawn, varied patchy cloud here and there, mostly in the west; some summits may be above/between cloud layers. Cloud will lift above the summits through morning. Above 90%	Likely none A few ragged mist patches here and there on low slopes at dawn, soon lifting and dissipating for clear hills. 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sun. Very good visibility.	Extensive sunshine; some scattered fair weather and high cloud building. Good visibility but some haze around.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	8C rising to 15C. 7C rising to 20C, or slightly cooler in valleys towards the northwest.	8 or 9C, rising to 15C. 8C rising to 20C.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 23 August, 2026

A core of high pressure drifts over the country on Sunday, bringing light and varied wind, dry weather, and minimal hill cloud fairly widely. Northwest Scotland will see a westerly breeze with a little drizzle and lingering hill cloud. It will feel warm in England and Wales in the sunshine, but fair weather cloud will tend to build in the afternoon. Monday is settled too, but high pressure slips away to the northwest, facilitating a southeasterly wind into Wales, later more widely. Tuesday sees a return of low pressure from the south: temperatures will rise and patchy rain will increasingly spread northward with some local stronger wind. Conditions likely continue to unsettle as next weekend approaches with bands of heavy rain forming, varied conditions continuing through the weekend, and likely staying warm and somewhat humid.
