



## General Summary for Wednesday, 25 May, 2022



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 25 May, 2022

A cool and windy day; close to freezing point on highest Scottish summits plus considerable chill factor where exposed. Up to gale force on higher tops. A period of rain passes eastwards, followed by showers and rising cloud bases, but in western Scotland expect frequent rain much of the day, sleet on high tops.

#### Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Windy, notable chill factor. Frequent rain morning, but improving.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 25 May, 2022

| How windy? (On the summits)            | Southwest veering westerly 25 to 35mph, but in excess of 40mph over tops for periods.  |
| Effect of wind on you?                 | <b>Will impede walking for periods, especially over the tops where perhaps arduous at times with considerable wind chill.</b>  |
| How wet?                               | <b>Showery rain, mostly morning</b><br>Showery bursts of rain through the morning, some heavy. These lingering through lunchtime, but during the afternoon tending to ease and fizzle out to leave just brief passing showers. |
| Cloud on the hills?                    | <b>Extensive, lifting to the tops; may break.</b><br>Cloud will extensively shroud the mountains with bases through the morning around 500-800m. In the afternoon, bases lifting and mostly becoming confined to tops.         |
| Chance of cloud free summits?          | <b>20% lifting to 60%</b>  |
| Sunshine?<br>Air clarity (below cloud) | Mostly cloudy, some patchy sun may develop in afternoon.<br>Visibility often poor morning, then becoming good or very good.  |
| How Cold? (at 900m)                    | 5C lifting to 7C.<br>Wind chill will make it feel as cold as -7C on higher tops.   |
| Freezing Level                         | Above the summits.   |

| <b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>                | Southwesterly increasing through day to around 25 to 35mph, risk 40mph for a time tops.  | Westerly, 25 to 35mph, perhaps 40mph for a time higher mountains. Speeds tending to lessen toward evening.   |
| <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>                     | <b>Will become fairly arduous through the day, especially across the tops, with marked wind chill and buffeting.</b>   | <b>Considerable buffeting and wind chill, risk of arduous walking conditions on higher terrain for several hours at least.</b>   |
| <b>How wet?</b><br>(Precipitation and its impact) | <b>Drizzly rain increasingly setting in</b><br>Areas of rain and drizzle will become increasingly persistent through the day across western areas. More intermittent across east Wales.              | <b>Rare showers fading</b><br>Much of the day likely dry, but there may be an odd shower, mainly in the morning.   |
| <b>Cloud on the hills?</b>                        | <b>Extensive</b><br><br>Cloud will cover the hills extensively in fog throughout the day. General bases around 500-700m, lowest on west coastal hills. Some higher breaks across east and mid-Wales. | <b>Clearing</b><br><br>Patches of cloud covering higher mountains for periods in the morning, but tending to lift and break up to leave the mountains generally clear. |
| <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>              | <b>20%</b>   | <b>70%</b>   |
| <b>Sunshine?</b><br>Air clarity (below cloud)     | Little or no sun.<br><br>Fairly murky with poor visibility in rain.  | Sun and broken cloud, perhaps increasingly sunny.<br><br>Visibility very good.   |
| <b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>                        | <b>7C</b>  | <b>5 to 7C</b>   |
| <b>Freezing Level</b>                             | Above the summits  | Above the summits.   |

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 26 May, 2022**

Blustery and cool with further showers coming in from the west later this week, but high pressure will be building from the south during Friday, extending across all areas into Saturday to bring fine and warmer conditions with light winds. High pressure is likely to stay nearby into early next week, but rather cool air may return from the north, so expect a few showers. Dropping chilly overnight where skies remain clear.
