

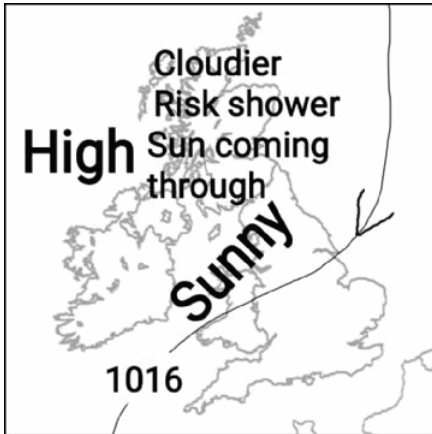
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Sunday, 19 May, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 19 May, 2024

Early areas of low cloud and fog will burn away through the morning to leave most mountains clear of cloud with periods of warm sunshine, most extensive for southwestern Scotland, as well as England and Wales. Cloud banks may persist for northern Scotland where it will be cooler. Risk isolated inland showers.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Fine with extensive sunshine and feeling warm. Beware sunburn and dehydration.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 19 May, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	East to northeasterly, 15 to 20mph, in places gusty 25mph at times.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but may feel noticeably breezy over some higher terrain, gusty around exposed spots and some passes.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any Rare fragments around some coastal slopes in north, may drift upslope locally.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny with very good visibility. Risk of local coastal fog banks mainly toward the north.
How Cold? (at 900m)	10 to 12C. May then drop cooler onward into night.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 10 to 20mph.	Easterly or variable 5 to 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but may be breezier at times, feeling rather cool on high tops.	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Chance of a shower Possible localised showers forming by the late afternoon, mainly just inland from west coast.	Mostly dry Risk of some isolated showers. Otherwise, dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Largely clear Any brief fragments soon dispersing.	Clear Mountains clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun. Visibility good, slight haze.	Sunshine and scattered cloud. Skies may fill in with cloud from the east later. Visibility mostly good or very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C, rising toward 10C especially western areas in afternoon.	8C lifting to 10C
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 20 May, 2024

Pressure stays fairly high early next week. Mostly dry and quite warm for many places, but feeling cooler toward the north and east for a few days as air circulates around from the north. Easterly breezes will remain most common. Low cloud eastern hills at times, western mountains more often clear. Localised showers forming in the afternoons. Risk of more widespread rain developing by midweek with lower pressure likely, but much uncertainty about the position of developing weather systems by this stage.
