

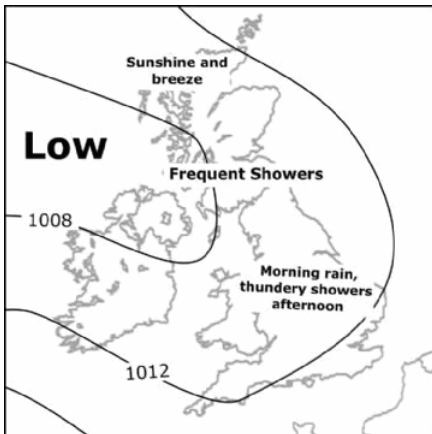
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Sunday, 26 May, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 26 May, 2024

Low pressure system drifting from the Atlantic brings unstable weather, lot of clouds, frequent showers and more than occasional thunderstorms, especially in northern England. Strong gusts are expected by thunderstorms, especially in Welsh mountains and in Peak District. Best conditions likely in Northwest Highlands.

#### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Frequent rain, partly thundery. Gusty.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 26 May, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to southwesterly, 20 to 30mph, with gusts up to 40mph possible on the highest tops.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small on lower hills, moderate on the tops. In the afternoon, walking may become strenuous on exposed ridges.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Light rain morning, later thundery showers.</b> Often raining in the morning, short dry period before noon. Around noon widely developing showers and risk of thunderstorms. Most persistent rain in the afternoon on westernmost part of the National Park.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills covered extensively, afternoon slowly lifting.</b> Clouds covering mountains from start of the day, slowly lifting, uncovering some lower elevated areas in the afternoon. Higher ridges and tops presumably covered all day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10% rising to 40%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Mostly dull, chance for few sunbeams through the clouds in the afternoon between the showers. Poor visibility, improving if clouds lift.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	6 to 9C, feeling close to freezing where exposed to strong winds.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

	<b>Monday 27 May</b>	<b>Tuesday 28 May</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly to southwesterly, 20 to 30mph with gusts on the highest ridges reaching 40mph. <b>Walking and balance starts to be affected especially on ridges. Walking strenuous on the highest tops. Feeling chilly.</b>	Southwesterly 25 to 40mph <b>Be prepared for very blustery or at times across western hills arduous conditions with considerable buffeting.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Light rain start, later only local showers.</b> Some light rain spots in the morning, those most likely in National Park area. Risk of localised showers passing eastwards, but generally improving conditions during the afternoon.	<b>Rain breaking up into heavy showers.</b> A front will progress northeast bringing periods of rain and drizzle, before tending to break up into areas of showery and at times heavy rain, risk of thunder.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Morning mostly covered, later often clearing.</b> Hills often covered at start, lifting during the day, clearing most tops. Clouds may return to the hills briefly if showers occur.	<b>Extensive, best breaks afternoon in east.</b> Cloud will shroud the hills extensively through the day, Bases to lower slopes in the west in the morning, before slow rise. Best breaks afternoon in the east.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20% rising to 70%</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Some sunshine through the clouds coming in the afternoon, most likely in central Wales. Good visibility if below the clouds.	Often overcast, but scope for some patchy sun to break through at times, mainly across east Wales. Rather murky, with poor visibility in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	3 to 6C. Feeling below freezing where exposed to the wind. Above the summits.	9C, but feeling close to freezing in the wind on tops. Above the summits

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 27 May, 2024**

Bank Holiday is likely to stay wet in Scotland and northern England, with widely spread showers from the Highlands to the Lakes. Occasional showers may also sweep across Pennines and Snowdonia. Warm front from the west coming on Tuesday brings more persistent, but usually less intense rain. Following this, a northerly flow and high pressure building from the west, brings optimism for improving conditions and sunnier end of the week, while temperatures likely staying similar or even dropping slightly.
