

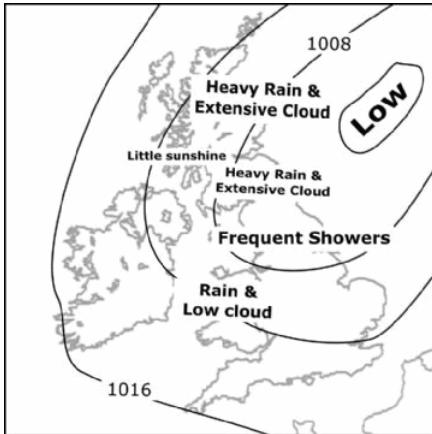

General Summary for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 July, 2024

Rain widely in Highlands, particularly Cairngorms, where risk of local flooding - although very little rain in total near west coast and central belt. Showery bursts of rain southern Scotland southwards, although total rainfall in Wales (specially south and east) will be small. Hardly any sunshine and many higher areas foggy.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Showers, frequent in the west, gusty winds

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest turning northwesterly, 25 to 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Expect blustery conditions over some hills, affecting comfortable walking and feeling cool on exposed terrain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showery rain Drizzly showers in places the rain frequent throughout the morning western mountains; very little if any rain elsewhere.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive Fog across higher areas from dawn, and on western mountains cloud base often below 400m. Will tend to improve, in the afternoon cloud base typically 500m west to 750m east Wales.
Chance of cloud free summits?	10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun, mainly east Wales. Visibility mostly good, particularly east Wales, but poor during rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7 to 9C. Feeling close to freezing where exposed to stronger wind speeds on tops.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

	Thursday 11 July	Friday 12 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 15mph, becoming northeasterly and strengthening to 20-25mph.	Mostly northerly, 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers afternoon Mostly dry morning, showery rain afternoon.	Mostly dry, highest risk rain west coast Inland an odd shower possible, but most likely dry. By the coast slightly higher risk of light rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Foggy morning, later patchy cloud Foggy start, both in valleys and on the tops. Later valleys clearing, higher up variable, patches of clouds coming and going, but most of the time clear.	Foggy morning, later hills clear In the morning low cloud in the valleys, tops mostly above the clouds. Later cloud lifting and widely breaking.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy, a few bright spells in the morning toward the south. Visibility becoming very good.	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	6 or 7C	8 to 10C
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 11 July, 2024

Cool rest of the week. On Thursday light showers, particularly in northern England, southern Scotland and Wales, Highlands mostly dry. Generally improving toward the weekend, locally showers on Friday, wettest in northern Scotland. Low still circulating east of England may bring wet spells on eastern Highlands and Cheviots on both Friday and during the weekend, but western Highlands, Lake District and Pennines should stay mostly dry and get some sun. Again more widespread rain beginning of next week.
