

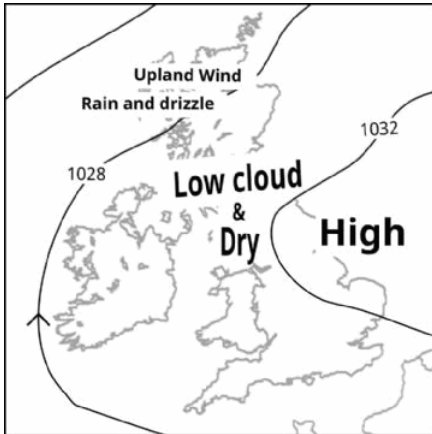
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Saturday, 2 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 November, 2024

Widely dull and murky, breaks in cloud most likely in eastern Scotland and western Wales. Rain or drizzle in West and Northwest Highlands, elsewhere most likely dry. In northern Scotland windy, elsewhere mostly light winds. Mild.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Dry, cloudy, some tops may be above cloud. Mild

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 2 November, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable, mostly southeasterly, 10 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Most likely extensive, tops perhaps clear Low cloud from valley bottom upward, lifting a little through the day. Highest tops have chance to be above the cloud. North/east and north of Snowdon range better chances for cloud-free hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Little or no sunshine at all to east Wales, near Snowdon and west of it sunny spells. Very good visibility if not in cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7 to 9C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

	Sunday 3 November	Monday 4 November
How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly, 15-20mph.	Southeasterly, most of the time less than 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.	Small or negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain unlikely Extensively dry, but chance drizzle here and there east Wales.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied low cloud banks, clear higher up Low cloud and fog in the valleys, from mid-slopes upward clear. On some lower eastern hills, low cloud banks may persist all day. Clear breaks best toward west and northwest.	Extensive, but may break up Confidence low: Cloud probably extensive above 500m from dawn and there may all be ribbons of fog on some lower slopes and in valleys (particularly east Wales). The cloud may partially or completely break up through the day.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Plenty of sunshine and excellent visibility if above the cloud. Patchy mist lower down, particularly east.	Cloud may break to give extensive sunshine. Persistently hazy.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8 to 10C, lower down much colder.	6C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 3 November, 2024

High pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until Tuesday afternoon, when a weak front passage will deteriorate weather for a day along the western coastal mountains especially. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week. During the weekend, more often wet conditions are likely, but at this stage uncertainty is still fairly high.
